1. Background

1.1 Sale FC Rugby Club, established in 1861 and resident at Heywood Road since 1905, is a well-established sports stadium and club and benefits currently from premises licence PL000417.



2. Application for the Grant of a Variation to a Premises Licence

- On 4th August, 2016 the Licensing Section received an application (Appendix A) from Mr Michael Jefferson, Chief Executive Officer on behalf of Sale FC Rugby Club for the grant of a variation to their existing premises licence PL000417 (Appendix B).
- **2.2** The application requests the addition of Regulated Entertainment Recorded Music (Outdoors) for the playing of amplified music and voices at :
 - rugby games midweek 18:00 to 21:00
 - Saturday and Sunday 14:00 to 17:00
 - Bank Holidays 14:00 to 17:00
- **2.3** The premises licence PL000417 (**Appendix B**), currently has Regulated Entertainment Indoors only as follows:

Regulated Entertainment – Recorded Music (Indoors):

Sunday to Thursday	11:00 – 23:00
Friday and Saturday	11:00 – 23:30

- **2.4** The application has been submitted as the current Live Music Act 2013 requires that a licence must be in place during the exemption hours of 08:00 to 23:00 hours if the premises :
 - provides amplified live or recorded music to an audience of more than 500 people.
- **2.5** The applicant envisages that audience capacity may reach as high as 2,000 for certain games as identified in **2.2** above.
- **2.6** The applicant has complied with all requirements under the application process including advertising the application in a newspaper, advertising by way of public notice at the premises and submitting a copy of the complete application to all Responsible Authorities. The application is deemed to be correctly submitted.
- **2.7** On 1st September, and mindful of the representation from the resident, Rachael Hall, EHO for Pollution and Housing Team, Regulatory Services, arranged and attended a meeting with the applicant at the premises.
- **2.8** Following discussions and negotiations between the applicant and Trafford Council Regulatory Services, Pollution and Housing agreement was reached to include as a safeguard, certain conditions on any granted licence.
- **2.9 Appendix C** details the email negotiation and discussion between the applicant and Trafford Council Regulatory Services, Pollution and Housing.
- 2.10 The agreed conditions are as follows :
 - 1. The Licence holder shall ensure that noise from music and associated sources (including DJ and amplified voices) must not be audible such that it constitutes a nuisance at any noise sensitive properties. (Guidance to be provided by Environmental Health Officer).
 - 2. The broadcasting of amplified voices outdoors will not be permitted beyond 2100 hours at any time, other than for emergency purposes.
 - 3. The broadcasting of amplified music on a Sunday shall be permitted between the hours of 1400 and 1500hrs, followed by short bursts of amplified music/voices played during a match, and during half time. All amplified music and voices to terminate by 1700hrs.

3. Representations

- **3.1** At the end of the consultation period, a letter of representation was received from a local resident, Councillor Chris Boyes, (**Appendix D**).
- **3.2** The Committee are respectfully advised that the representation received against the application relates to the Licensing Objective:
 - Prevention of Public Nuisance

- **3.3** It is recommended that, in borderline cases, the benefit of the doubt about any aspect of a representation should be given to the person making that representation. The subsequent hearing would then provide an opportunity for the person or body making the representation to amplify and clarify it.
- **3.4** The Members will be required to determine the relevance of the representations.
- **3.5** When considering the relevance of the representation the Licensing Sub-Committee must apply three rules:
 - i. the representation must be from persons who live, or are involved in a business in the area and are likely to be affected by the application;
 - ii. it must not be repetitious, vexatious or frivolous;
 - iii. it must relate to one or more of the licensing objectives.

4. Licensing Policy and Guidance

4.1 The Committee are respectfully referred to the Council's own Licensing Policy relating to the Licensing Act 2003 objectives and to the Secretary of State's Guidance. (Copy available at meeting)

5. Options

- **5.1** The Sub-Committee to take such steps as they consider necessary for the promotion of the Licensing Objectives in accordance with the provisions of subsection (4) of the Licensing Act 2003. The steps specified are:
 - 5.1.1 To grant the licence subject to-
 - Conditions consistent with the operating schedule accompanying the application modified to such extent as the authority considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives, and;
 - Any mandatory conditions which must be included under the Licensing Act 2003
 - **5.1.2** to exclude from the scope of the licence any of the licensable activities to which the application relates;
 - 5.1.3 to refuse to specify a person in the licence as the premises supervisor;
 - **5.1.4** to reject the application.

- **5.2** The Sub-Committee is advised that any findings on any issues of fact should be on the balance of probability and any decision should be based on the individual merits of the application.
- **5.3** The Sub-Committee, in arriving at its decision, must have regard to relevant provisions of national guidance and its own statement of licensing policy and reasons should be given for any departure.

ANNEX 1 - MANDATORY CONDITIONS

1. Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied except during the hours granted on the licence and the following:

On New Year's Eve from the end of licensing hours on New Year's Eve to the start of licensing hours on the

following day (or, if there are no licensing hours on the following day, midnight on 31st December)

- 2. The above restrictions do not prohibit:
 - (a) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises;
 - (b) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the taking of the alcohol from the premises unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel;
 - (c) during the first thirty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises by persons taking meals there if the alcohol was supplied for consumption as ancillary to meals;
 - (d) consumption of alcohol on the premises or the taking of sale or supply of alcohol to any person residing in the licensed premises;
 - (e) the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the dispatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered;
 - (f) the sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club;
 - (g) the sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's naval, military or air forces;
 - (h) the taking of alcohol from the premises by a person residing there; or
 - the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of the alcohol by persons so supplied; or
 - (j) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of liquor so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.
- 3. No person under fourteen shall be in the bar of the licensed premises during the permitted hours unless one of the following applies:
 - (a) He is the child of the holder of the premises licence.
 - (b) He resides in the premises, but is not employed there.
 - (c) He is in the bar solely for the purpose of passing to or from some part of the premises which is not a bar and to or from which there is no other convenient means of access or egress.
 - (d) The bar is in railway refreshment rooms or other premises constructed, fitted and intended to be used bona fide for any purpose to which the holding of the licence is ancillary
- 4. In this condition "bar" includes any place exclusively or mainly used for the consumption of alcohol. But an area is not a bar when it is usual for it to be, and it is, set apart for the service of table meals and alcohol is only sold or supplied to persons as an ancillary to their table meals.
- 5. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence -
 - (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises, or
 - (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal

licence is suspended.

- 6. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 7. Where the premises licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, each such individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.
- 8. The sale/supply of intoxicating liquor to be restricted to the pre-constructed bar areas as shown on the plans submitted to the court and relevant authorities amendment to which cannot be made without consultation and prior approval from such authorities.
- 9. CCTV to be installed and be operational at all times members of the public are present, showing (a) the entrances of the hospitality lounges at the rear of the north stand (b) entrance and exits to bar on east stand (c) any structure in birtles stand serving as a bar.
- 10. The sale/supply of intoxicating liquor or any other liquid refreshment for consumption in the open air within the ground must be provided in containers other than glassware.
- 11. No Off Sales.
- 12. No application to be made under the authority of this licence for the grant of an occasional licence.
- 13. Should the operation of Sale RUFC move to premises other than those subject of this application on a permanent basis The Justices Licence will be surrendered.

ADDITIONAL MANDATORY CONDITIONS

- 14. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
- 15. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 16. Certain "irresponsible" drinks promotions are banned. An irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children -
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to -
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the

- premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
- (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
- (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on -
- (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
- (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
- (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.

Further to your email and telephone call, I am happy to vary my recommended conditions to the following:

1. The Licence holder shall ensure that noise from music and associated sources (including DJ and amplified voices) must not be audible such that it constitutes a nuisance at any noise sensitive properties. (Guidance to be provided by Environmental Health Officer).

2. The broadcasting of amplified voices outdoors will not be permitted beyond 2100 hours at any time, other than for emergency purposes.

3. The broadcasting of amplified music on a Sunday shall be permitted between the hours of 1400 and 1500hrs, followed by short bursts of amplified music/voices played during a match, and during half time. All amplified music and voices to terminate by 1700hrs.

Dear Mike,

Thank you for meeting me this morning to discuss your application for variation of the Premises Licence for Sale Football Club.

As I understand it - you have been hosting Rugby League games on a Sunday afternoon from January this year (final game of the season is next weekend). This involves the playing of amplified music between the hours of 1400 to 1500 hrs (prior to the game) followed by subsequent bursts of music lasting a few seconds, when there is a score. I understand that games terminate before 1700hrs.

For the purpose of your application for variation, you have also stated that you intend to hold occasional mid-week evening games (approx 10 per year) where the same will apply between the hours of 1830 and 2100hrs. I cannot recall as to whether you said that this already happens?

To confirm, our Service has not received any complaints about the activities described, however, today, Councillor J Boyes has made a representation to your application for variation.

For me - the only area of uncertainty lies with the difference in the volume of the music expected for Rugby League games as opposed to Union games.

I understand from your explanation that League games are more entertainment orientated. You explained that you have had to ask for them to decrease the volume on the amp a couple of times on a Sunday because you were unhappy that the neighbours might be affected. Obviously this needs to be addressed to prevent any future issues. I suggested that you photograph the settings on the Amp to illustrate the volume settings that are in use during Union matches. Next time there is a League match - start at this level and maybe increase it a little to see if you can find a compromise that suits both parties - whilst not generating complaints. I trust that you have had a full season's experience of doing this already with no complaints directed to the Council. It would be helpful if you photograph this setting (if it turns out to be any different from the Union setting) and formalise this arrangement as a condition when your facilities are being let.

If there are problems with this level in the future - then I would be more than happy to visit and advise. Obviously, in view of the fact that we have received the representation on the last day of consultation, and have received no other complaints - I have been unable to witness the noise in question.

I am happy with this as a way forward and have no legitimate reason at this time to raise any objection to your application for variation; however, as a safeguard I would suggest that the following conditions be attached to your licence:

1. The Licence holder shall ensure that noise from music and associated sources (including DJ and amplified voices) must not be audible such that it constitutes a nuisance at any noise sensitive properties. (Guidance to be provided by Environmental Health Officer).

2. Use of outdoor amplified voices will not be permitted beyond 2100hours at any time, other than for emergency purposes.

3. The use of amplified music on a Sunday shall be permitted between the hours of 1400 and 1500hrs, followed by short bursts (less than 10 seconds) of amplified music/voices played during a match, to be broadcast in the event of a score. All amplified music and voices to terminate by 1700hrs.

In terms of your future proposals to alter the site layout, you would need to contact the Licensing Service to determine whether a further variation to your premises licence would be required.

Please can you confirm as to whether you think this is an accurate record of our discussions today, and whether you are happy for my suggested conditions to be attached to your new licence.

I wish to comment upon the above noted application. I feel that to have extremely loud music played well over a dozen times a year, **principally on what might be considered quiet Sunday afternoons**, will be an unreasonable and persistent disturbance to my lifestyle and indeed could be considered **a public nuisance** within a mainly residential area.

You will perhaps not be aware that Sale Football Club (aka Sale Rugby Club) who were formed in 1861 for the purposes of playing Rugby Football (now known as Rugby Union) have recently contracted with a Rugby League Club to allow them to play all of their home fixtures from January until September at Heywood Road.

It is worth pointing out that until the Union game went professional there was no Rugby played at Heywood Road from May 1st until August 31st inclusive (it was not allowed). Hence the Summer months were ones of peace and quiet not only on Sundays but for the whole week, excluding perhaps the sound of the odd tractor pulling gang mowers.

By its very nature the current ethos of Rugby League is to have extremely loud pre and post match 'entertainment' in the form of recorded music and it is this intrusion which I consider is the unreasonable disturbance and a potential public nuisance.

As a minimum I would request that the Licensing Committee place further restrictions on the allowed timings for the playing of music outdoors and also most especially place a restriction on the allowed volume
