1. Introduction

- 1.1 Section 100 of the Licensing Act 2003 outlines the procedure whereby an application can be made to the Licensing Authority for a Temporary Event Notice.
- 1.2 The Police Reform and Social Responsibility Act 2011 amended the Licensing Act 2003 to make the Local Authority's Environmental Health department a "relevant person" in making objections to a Temporary Event Notice.
- 1.3 Section 105(2) of the Licensing Act 2003 states that when an objection is made by a relevant person in respect of a Temporary Event Notice, the authority must:
 - (a) hold a hearing to consider the objection notice, unless the premises user, the relevant person who gave the objection notice and the authority agree that a hearing is unnecessary, and
 - (b) having regard to the objection notice, give the premises user a counter notice under this section if it considers it necessary for the promotion of a licensing objective to do so.
- 1.4 Section 105(4) of the Licensing Act 2003 states that a decision must be made under subsection (2)(b), and the requirements of subsection (3) must be met, at least 24 hours before the beginning of the event period specified in the Temporary Event Notice.

2. Background

- 2.1 On the 23rd November 2017 the Licensing section received two Temporary Event Notices from Mr. Mehmet Keskin of the Station Bar & Grill Limited, for the premises known as Station Bar & Grill, 25-29 Station Road, Urmston, M41 9JG. Station Bar & Grill currently has a Premises Licence (PL049273) authorising licensable activities for the ground floor restaurant.
- 2.2 The applications were electronically served via the GOV.UK facility in the evening (18:10hrs 18:20hrs) of the 22nd November 2017 and subsequently served on the relevant persons on the 23rd November 2017, therefore the last day for objections being the 28th November 2017 (being 3 working days after day of being served).
- 2.3 A copy of the first Temporary Event Notice (066895) is attached at Appendix
 1. This TEN indicated he wished to provide the following licensable activities in the ground floor restaurant and the first floor function room;
 - Sale by retail of alcohol & provision of regulated entertainment for the following time and dates;

- A copy of the second Temporary Event Notice (066896) is attached at 2.4 Appendix 2. This Station Bar & Grill indicated he wished to provide the following licensable activities in the ground floor restaurant and the first floor function room:
 - Sale by retail of alcohol & provision of regulated entertainment for the following time and dates;
 - Thursday 28th December 2017 12:00-02:00
 Friday 29th December 2017 12:00-02:00

 - Saturday 30th December 2017 12:00-02:00
 - o Sunday 31st December 2017 12:00-03:00
 - Monday 1st January 2018 12:00-02:00
- The Temporary Event Notice is deemed to have been correctly submitted 2.5 within the prescribed limits in that the applications have not exceeded what is permitted under the Licensing Act 2003 Act.

3. Objection

On the 28th November 2017 the Licensing section received an objection from 3.1 Environmental Health Officer Mr. Peter Belfield objecting to both Temporary Event Notices. A copy of the representation is attached at Appendix 3.

4. **Licensing Policy and Guidance**

The Committee are respectfully referred to the Council's own Licensing Policy 4.1 relating to the Licensing Act 2003 objectives and to the Secretary of State's Guidance – at chapter 7 (copy available at meeting).

5. **Options**

- Section 105(3) of the Licensing Act 2003 states that the licensing authority 5.1 must-
 - (a) in a case where it decides not to give a counter notice under this section, give the premises user and the relevant person notice of the decision, and

Licensing Act 2003 - Station Bar & Grill, 25-29 Station Road, Urmston, M41 9JG

- (b) in any other case—
 - (i) give the premises user the counter notice and a notice stating the reasons for its decision, and
 - (ii) give each relevant person a copy of both of those notices.
- 5.2 The Licensing Act 2003 provides that only the licensing authority can impose conditions to a Temporary Event Notice from the existing conditions on the premises licence or club premises certificate at the venue.

The licensing authority can only do so:

- if the police or the EHA have objected to the Temporary Event Notice;
- if that objection has not been withdrawn;
- if there is a licence or certificate in relation to at least a part of the premises in respect of which the Temporary Event Notice is given;
- and if the licensing authority considers it appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives to impose one or more conditions.

This decision is one for the licensing authority alone, regardless of the premises user's views or willingness to accept conditions. The conditions must be notified to the premises user on the form prescribed by regulations.

- 5.3 The Sub-Committee is advised that any findings on any issues of fact should be on the balance of probability and any decision should be based on the individual merits of the application.
- 5.4 The Sub-Committee, in arriving at its decision, must have regard to relevant provisions of national guidance and its own statement of licensing policy and reasons should be given for any departure.

Firstly I should advise that the two submitted Temporary Event Notices (TENs) for events on 22nd-26th December 2017 and 28th December 2017 to 1st January 2018 may contravene the current planning permission that requires the bar, coffee lounge and restaurant to not be open to the public other than between the hours of 11:30 - 23:00 Monday to Friday, 11:30 - 23:30 Saturday, and 12:00 to 22:00 on Sundays and Bank Holidays, in order to protect the amenity of nearby residential properties. The use of the first floor as a function room and the late opening times of the premises are therefore potentially unauthorised.

The proposed licensable activities in each TEN relate to the supply of alcohol and the provision of regulated entertainment (assumed to be live and/or recorded music) until 2am, 3am or 4am within the restaurant/bar and function room over five successive nights from the Friday 22nd December 2017 and Thursday 28th December 2017, totalling ten nights of events over less than a two week period.

I therefore consider it necessary to raise an objection to the two submitted TENs on the grounds of the proposed events being in my opinion contrary to the promotion of the Licensing objective for the prevention of public nuisance.

I have recently objected to the granting of a Major Variation to the existing Premises Licence for these premises that seeks to extend the hours of Regulated Entertainment (indoors) for Live and Recorded Music and to incorporate the first floor function room within the licenced area due to similar concerns. This application is to be determined at a hearing of the Licensing Sub Committee at 3pm on Monday 4th December 2017.

For reference, I have attached my comments detailing the reasons for my objection to the Variation application that are relevant in considering the suitability of the two submitted TENs.

Given that residential accommodation is structurally attached to the licenced premises, with the first floor room directly sharing a party wall with a habitable room of the adjoining flat, there is a clear potential for entertainment noise to be audible within the adjoining dwellings to the extent that would cause undue disturbance, especially when residents could be expected to be relaxing or asleep.

As I pointed out in my comments relating to the Variation application, complaints from residents relating to the use of the premises for functions and events have been received over a number of years, requiring informal action to be taken by this Service. The proposal detailed by the TENs represents an intensification in the use of the premises and an extension of the operating hours well into night time hours. Any impact is therefore likely to be repeated on successive nights through the Christmas and New Year period.

I have been informed by the applicant's representative, that sound insulation materials have been applied to the first floor party wall. I would advise that sound insulation works have not been approved nor have I seen any documentation by a suitably qualified acoustician to demonstrate the benefit of such works.

I would point out however that the effectiveness of sound insulation is dependent on the quality of materials and workmanship in addition to the nature of sound to be attenuated. For example, low frequency bass beat is not well attenuated by typical sound insulation. Furthermore, structural borne sound transmission can occur though structural elements connected to the function room, resulting in 'flanking transmissions' that can pass above, below or around the partition and any sound insulation applied to it.

There is therefore an unacceptable risk that noise will be audible within the adjoining residential flats and since such noise could continue well into the night time period, the impact of any disturbance is likely to be high.

The existing Premises Licence implements a curfew on regulated entertainment at midnight between Thursday and Saturday and 2300h at other times. Whilst this exceeds the Planning restrictions to an extent, I feel that the existing Licensing restrictions impose a sensible control that should be maintained to protect residents sharing the same building from undue disturbance. The use of the first floor should be restricted to a restaurant, in line with the current planning controls that serve to protect residential amenity.

I understand that a counter notice will be issued and the matter will be determined at a forthcoming Licensing Sub-committee hearing.
