

1. Background

1.1 1 Warwick Road South, Old Trafford, Manchester, M16 9AL is a large commercial unit within the cordoned confines of a metal fence perimeter.

Situated on Warwick Road South the premises is a brick built office block/warehouse and storage unit and the applicant plans to run a public bar from the location.

The office/warehouse block will be utilised as the bar and the storage unit will be used to house stock and supplies.



The office/warehouse block was previously used by an electrical company and the property is situated on the junction of Ayres Road and Warwick Road South and opposite the entrance/exit to the southbound line of the Metrolink.

The Premises does not currently benefit from a premises licence.



2. Application for the Grant of a Premises Licence

- **2.1** On 11th January, 2017 the Licensing Section received an application (**Appendix A**) from Mrs Kay Ruby, Director of Yummy Restaurant Limited for the grant of a new premises licence.
- **2.2** The proposal is to run a "fan zone" style premises for match days only.
- **2.3** The application requests the granting of a premises licence for :

<u>Sale of Alcohol</u> (on and off the premises): Monday to Sunday 11:00 – 23:00


<u>Regulated Entertainment</u> – Films (Indoors) and Live and Recorded Music (Indoors & Outdoors) for the playing of amplified music and voices :

Monday to Sunday 11:00 to 23:00

2.4 The applicant has complied with all requirements under the application process including advertising the application in a newspaper, advertising by way of public notice at the premises and submitting a copy of the complete application to all Responsible Authorities. The application is deemed to be correctly submitted.

3. Representations

- **3.1** During the consultation period, an email representation (**Appendix B**) was received from Peter Belfield, EHO for Pollution and Housing Team, Regulatory Services
- 3.2 Also during the consultation period, three emails of representation were received from local residents shown on the following location map. (Appendices C, D and E).
- 3.3 The Committee are respectfully advised that the representations received against the application broadly relate to the Licensing Objectives.
- 3.4 The Members are advised that The Government's Guidance states that it is not sufficient for an objector to simply state that they wish to object, or that they are objecting on noise grounds. A representation should give more detail of the likely impact should the licence be granted.
- 3.5 It is recommended that, in borderline cases, the benefit of the doubt about any aspect of a representation should be given to the person making that representation. The subsequent hearing would then provide an opportunity for the person or body making the representation to amplify and clarify it.



5. Options

- 5.1 The Sub-Committee to take such steps as they consider necessary for the promotion of the Licensing Objectives in accordance with the provisions of subsection 18 (4) of the Licensing Act 2003. The steps specified are:
 - **5.1.1** To grant the licence subject to-
 - Conditions consistent with the operating schedule accompanying the application modified to such extent as the authority considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives, and;
 - Any mandatory conditions which must be included under the Licensing Act 2003
 - **5.1.2** to exclude from the scope of the licence any of the licensable activities to which the application relates;
 - **5.1.3** to refuse to specify a person in the licence as the premises supervisor;
 - **5.1.4** to reject the application.
- 5.2 The Sub-Committee is advised that any findings on any issues of fact should be on the balance of probability and any decision should be based on the individual merits of the application.
- 5.3 The Sub-Committee, in arriving at its decision, must have regard to relevant provisions of national guidance and its own statement of licensing policy and reasons should be given for any departure.








Hi Jan,

Unfortunately I need to raise an objection to the granting of this Premises Licence.

Licensable activities have taken place on these premises on a number of occasions recently under a Temporary Event Notice, on dates coinciding with football matches at MUFC, most recently on Sunday 15th January 2017. Officers visited the area following the match and noted that music noise levels emanating from the premises were excessive at residential properties in close proximity, principally from a PA system installed outside the building.

The Premises Licence application proposes the supply of alcohol and amplified music including DJs and live bands, taking place both inside and outside the premises on any day up to 2300h. This is not suitable for a residential area due to the significant potential for noise from entertainment and patrons to cause undue impacts of nuisance.

Should the scope of the applied for licence be utilised in full, then the premises could become a regular live music and entertainment venue. The building is a former commercial unit and is not designed to contain such sound, being of low rise and with a thin roof and large openings. Noise breakout would be very difficult to control bearing in mind the need for suitable internal levels to satisfy the audience, especially in respect of live bands. Any entertainment provision outside could increase the range of impacts over a significantly wider area.

I understand the Live Music Act 2012 would deregulate certain entertainment provision up to 2300hrs, however in view of the premises not benefitting from an alcohol on-licence this should not be applicable in this case.

My recommendation would be to object to the application on the basis of it not meeting the licensing objective for the prevention of public nuisance.

There may also be Planning requirements with respect to a potential change of use of the premises to a drinking establishment or entertainment club venue. It is likely that the potential for adverse impacts would be highlighted to Planners if this is the case.

Below are my reasons for objection:

- * This property is situated quite close to Faizane Islam mosque with teaches children. Kids and parents walk past here and also sometimes women hang around to collect their children.
