Report Title

Agreement for the delivery of a Growth Deal 2 Funded Cycle Parking Scheme – Marsland Road, Brooklands Metro Station, Sale.

Summary

To seek approval to authorise the execution of a Delivery Agreement between Greater Manchester Combined Authority, Transport for Greater Manchester and Trafford Council, associated with the delivery and implementation of a Cycling Park scheme on Marsland Road, adjacent to Brooklands Metro Station in Sale.

- 1. To authorise the completion of an appropriate legal agreement in accordance with the details outlined in this report (and to authorise the completion of any subsequent minor amendments of such a legal agreement).
- 2. Approve the spend from the Capital Programme financed by the of the capital grant of £24,500.00 Brooklands cycle shelter.

1.0 Background

- 1.1 The Greater Manchester Growth Deal sets out a multi-million pound investment programme that will support economic growth in the area. The Greater Manchester Local Enterprise Partnership has agreed an expansion to its Growth Deal with the Government which will see an extra £56.6m invested in Greater Manchester between 2016 and 2021. This Cycle scheme sits within the Additional Priorities element of the funding under the Transport Works Programme which will provide a better integrated transport network across Greater Manchester.
- 1.2 The objective of the proposed measures is to enhance the cycle facilities at Metro and Rail stations to the standard set out in the Greater Manchester Cycling Design Guide. One of the key mayoral priorities is to achieve more trips being made by bicycle across the region and this project clearly fits within this priority. The results of a 2011 TfGM online survey showed that Greater Manchester residents highlight a number of barriers as to why they do not choose to cycle to interchanges for all or as part of multi-stage journey. Two of the principle reasons for this that was outlined in the survey were: firstly, they do not perceive the journey to be safe and secondly they fear that their bike will be stolen or damaged when parked^[1]. In the recent Bikelife report for Greater Manchester produced by Sustrans, only 24% of people think the security of bicycle parking is good in the region. This scheme seeks to address the concerns raised in the survey by providing a safer journey and secure easily accessible cycle storage which should encourage people who want to cycle as well as benefiting those that already cycle.

2.0 Other Options

- 2.1 Installation of Sheffield stand cycle parking
 - Another option would be to install cycle parking without any shelter. Although
 this provides a facility for people to lock their bikes. Due to not having any
 shelter is not protected against direct sunlight or rain. Resulting in wet seats
 and damage to the bikes over time.

The opportunity to make improvements to address the concerns above will improve the amenities and facilities for the local community & provide a safe cycle parking facility.

3.0 Consultation

- 3.1 An initial informal consultation was undertaken with ward councillors and the Café which is situated directly to the west of the proposed cycle parking facility.
- 3.2 No comments were received from ward councillors.
- 3.3 The owner of the Café had no objections to the proposed cycle parking facilities but asked that the design take into consideration a proposal they have to construct some decking on the nearby embankment.
- 3.4 The owner of the café will be notified of the council's decision.

4.0 Reasons for Recommendation

4.1 To provide the users of the Metrolink and surrounding amenities with safe cycling parking for people who want to cycle. By removing the existing barriers, the proposed works will promote sustainable modes of travel.
