# 1. Background

**1.1** Unit 7, 26 Chorlton Street, Old Trafford, Manchester, M16 9HN is a commercial unit on the ground floor of a 5 storey block of apartments.

The premises is a brick built commercial / residential block and the applicant plans to run a convenience store from the location.



The Premises does not currently benefit from a premises licence.

# 2. Application for the Grant of a Premises Licence

- 2.1 On 24<sup>th</sup> July, 2017 the Licensing Section received an application (Appendix A) from Mr Paul Sherratt of Licensing Matters acting as agent for Stars Mcr Stretford Rd Branch Limited for the grant of a new premises licence.
- **2.2** The application requests the granting of a premises licence for :


<u>Sale of Alcohol</u> (Off the premises): Monday to Sunday 07:00 – 23:00

**2.3** The applicant has complied with all requirements under the application process including advertising the application in a newspaper, advertising by way of public notice at the premises and submitting a copy of the complete application to all Responsible Authorities. The application is deemed to be correctly submitted.

# 3. Representations

- **3.1** There have been no representations from any of the responsible authorities.
- **3.2** During the consultation period, representations were received from local residents shown on the location map overleaf and detailed in (**Appendix B1-9**).

- **3.3** The Committee are respectfully advised that the representations received against the application broadly relate to the Licensing Objectives of Public Nuisance.
- **3.4** The Members are advised that The Government's Guidance states that it is not sufficient for an objector to simply state that they wish to object, or that they are objecting on noise grounds. A representation should give more detail of the likely impact should the licence be granted.
- **3.5** It is recommended that, in borderline cases, the benefit of the doubt about any aspect of a representation should be given to the person making that representation. The subsequent hearing would then provide an opportunity for the person or body making the representation to amplify and clarify it.
- **3.6** The Members are therefore required to determine the relevance of all representations.
- **3.8** When considering the relevance of any representation the Licensing Sub-Committee must be aware that :
  - i. the representation can be from any person or body;
  - ii. it must not be repetitious, vexatious or frivolous;
  - iii. it must relate to one or more of the licensing objectives.

# 4. Licensing Policy and Guidance

**4.1** The Committee are respectfully referred to the Council's own Licensing Policy relating to the Licensing Act 2003 objectives and to the Secretary of State's Guidance. (Copy available at meeting).

# 5. Options

- **5.1** The Sub-Committee to take such steps as they consider necessary for the promotion of the Licensing Objectives in accordance with the provisions of subsection 18 (4) of the Licensing Act 2003. The steps specified are:
  - **5.1.1** To grant the licence subject to-
    - Conditions consistent with the operating schedule accompanying the application modified to such extent as the authority considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives, and;
    - Any mandatory conditions which must be included under the Licensing Act 2003
  - **5.1.2** to exclude from the scope of the licence any of the licensable activities to which the application relates;
  - **5.1.3** to refuse to specify a person in the licence as the premises supervisor;
  - **5.1.4** to reject the application.
- **5.2** The Sub-Committee is advised that any findings on any issues of fact should be on the balance of probability and any decision should be based on the individual merits of the application.
- **5.3** The Sub-Committee, in arriving at its decision, must have regard to relevant provisions of national guidance and its own statement of licensing policy and reasons should be given for any departure.

#### Entitlement to work/immigration status for individual applicants and applications from partnerships which are not limited liability partnerships

A licence may not beheld by an incivio'ual or an individual in a partnership who is resident in the UK who:

- does not have the right to live and work in the UK; or
  - is subject to a condition preventing him or her from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

Any premises licence issued in respect of an application made on or after 6 April 2017 will become invalid if the holder trases to be entitled to work in the UK.

Acplicants must demonstrate that they have an entitlement to work in the UK and are not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity. They do this by providing with this application topics or scanned copies of the following documents (which do not need to be certified).

#### Documents which demonstrate entitlement to work in the UK

- An expired or current passport showing the holder, or a person named in the passport as the child of the holder, is A British citizen or a citizen of the UK and Colonies having the right of abode in the UK (please see note below about which sections of the passport to copy).
- An expired or current passport or national identity card showing the holder, or a person named in the passport
  as the child of the holder, is a national of a Luropean Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A Registration Certificate or document certifying permanent residence issued by the Home Office to a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A Permanent Residence Card issued by the Home Office to the family member of a hotlonal of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A current Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder indicating that the person named is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK, or has no time limit on their stay in the UK.
- A current passport endorsed to show that the holder is exemptifican immigration control, is allowed to stay
  indefinitely in the UK, has the right of abode in the UK, or has no time limit on their stay in the UK.
- A current immigration Status Document issued by the Home Office to the holder with an endorsement
  indicating that the named person is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK or has no time limit on their stay in
  the UK, when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National
  Insurance humber and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A full birth or adoption certificate issued in the UK which includes the name(s) of all least one of the holder's
  parents or adoptive parents, when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's
  permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A birth or adoption certificate issued in the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man or Ireland when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A certificate of registration or naturalisation as a British citizen, when produced in combination with an
  official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a
  Government agency or a previous employer.
- A current passport endorsed to show that the holder is allowed to stay in the UK and is currently allowed to
  work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a
  licensable activity.

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- A **current** Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder which indicates that the named person can currently slay in the UK and is allowed to work relation to the carrying on of a licensable activity.
- A current Residence Card issued by the Home Office to a person who is not a national of a Europeon Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights or residence.
- A current Immigration Status Document containing a photograph Issued by the Home Office to the holder with an endorsement indicating that the named person may stay in the UK, and Is allowed to work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name Issued by a Covernment agency or a previous employer.
- A Certificate of Application, less than 6 months old, issued by the Home Office under regulation 17(3) or 18A

   (2) of the Immigration (European Leonomic Area) Regulations 2006, to all person who is not a national of a European Economic Areal state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence.
- Reasonable evidence that the person has an outstanding application to vary their permission to be in the UK
  with the Home Office such as the Home Office acknowledgement letter or proof of postage evidence, or
  reasonable evidence that the person has an appeal or administrative review pending on an immigration
  decision, such as an appeal or administrative review reference number.
- Reasonable evidence that a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence in exercising treaty rights in the UK including;-
  - evidence of the applicant's own identity such as a passport.
  - evidence of their relationship with the European Economic Area family member e.g. a marriage certificate, civil partnership certificate or birth certificate, and
  - evidence that the European Economic Area national has a right of permanent residence in the UK or is one of the following if they have been in the UK for more than 3 months:




