### 1. Introduction

- **1.1** Section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003 outlines the procedure whereby an application can be made to the Licensing Authority for a new premises licence.
- **1.2** Section 18(3) of the Licensing Act 2003 states that where relevant representations are made in respect of such an application, the authority must:
  - (a) hold a hearing to consider them, unless the authority, the applicant and each person who has made such representations agree that a hearing is unnecessary, and
  - (b) having regard to the representations, take such of the steps mentioned in subsection (4) (if any) as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives.
- **1.3** The steps mentioned in subsection (4) are:
  - (a) to grant the licence subject to-
    - (i) the conditions mentioned in subsection (2)(a) modified to such extent as the authority considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives, and
    - (ii) any condition which must under section 19, 20 or 21 be included in the licence;
  - (b) to exclude from the scope of the licence any of the licensable activities to which the application relates;
  - (c) to refuse to specify a person in the licence as the premises supervisor;
  - (d) to reject the application.

### 2. Background

- 2.1 On the 18<sup>th</sup> October 2017 the Licensing section received an application from Mr. David Leape, for the grant of a new premises licence for the premise known as 192 Church Road, Urmston, Manchester, M41 9FD. A copy of this application is attached at **Appendix 1**.
- **2.2** As detailed in the application, the applicant has applied for the following licensable activities;
  - Supply of alcohol (on & off sales) Mon-Wed 12:00-23:00 / Thu-Sun 11:00-23:00

The applicant also intends to provide the following activities;

- Live music Mon-Wed 12:00-23:00 / Thu-Sun 11:00-23:00
- Recorded music Mon-Wed 12:00-23:00 / Thu-Sun 11:00-23:00
- Anything of a similar description as live music/recorded music/performance of dance - Mon-Wed 12:00-23:00 / Thu-Sun 11:00-23:00
- Late night refreshment Mon-Wed 12:00-23:00 / Thu-Sun 11:00-23:00

For the avoidance of doubt it is pertinent to note that the four activities listed above do not fall into the scope of the Licensing Act 2003 and hence the application has been amended to make that clear.

The Live Music Act 2012 deregulated live music, recorded music, performance of dance or anything of similar nature conducted between the hours of 08:00-23:00 with an audience of less than 500 people on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises.

Schedule 2 of the Licensing Act 2003 provides that the provision of late night refreshment is between the hours of 23:00-05:00.

**2.3** The applicant has complied with all requirements under the application process including advertising the application in a newspaper, advertising by way of public notice at the premises and submitting a copy of the complete application to all Responsible Authorities. The application is deemed to be correctly submitted.

### 3. Representations

- **3.1** The Licensing Authority has received representations from 4 local residents opposing the grant of the application. Copies of the representations are attached at **Appendix 2 (A-D)**.
- 3.2 In response to the representations that were received by the Licensing section and subsequently supplied to the applicant, the applicant has provided a supporting statement (outside of the consultation period, but relevant to the application) that he has requested be sent to those persons making representations. A copy of this supporting statement is attached at Appendix 3.

### 4. All-party Agreement

**4.1** Environmental Health Officer Mr. Peter Belfield agreed conditions with the applicant that are detailed in the All-party Agreement attached at **Appendix 4**.

### 5. Licensing Policy and Guidance

**5.1** The Committee are respectfully referred to the Council's own Licensing Policy relating to the Licensing Act 2003 objectives and to the Secretary of State's Guidance (copy available at meeting).

### 6. Options

- **6.1** The Sub-Committee are requested to consider the evidence and decide what (if any) steps to take as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives. The steps specified are:
  - (a) to grant the licence subject to-
    - (i) the conditions mentioned in subsection (2)(a) modified to such extent as the authority considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives, and
    - (ii) any condition which must under section 19, 20 or 21 be included in the licence;
  - (b) to exclude from the scope of the licence any of the licensable activities to which the application relates;
  - (c) to refuse to specify a person in the licence as the premises supervisor;
  - (d) to reject the application

and for this purpose the new conditions of the licence are modified if any of them is altered or omitted or any new condition is added.

- **6.2** The Sub-Committee is advised that any findings on any issues of fact should be on the balance of probability and any decision should be based on the individual merits of the application.
- **6.3** The Sub-Committee, in arriving at its decision, must have regard to relevant provisions of national guidance and its own statement of licensing policy and reasons should be given for any departure.





### Existing Environment

The immediate neighbourhood is a quiet residential area in the evenings.

There are already several food & drink establishments within a fifth of a mile of No 192 when travelling along Church Road in the direction of Flixton viz:

- 115yds New Rainbow Chinese take-a-way.
- 127yds Theru Kadai Indian cafe & take-a-way.
- 190yds 'Cafe & Coffee' cafe.
- 225yds The Roebuck Pub & Restaurant.
- 360yds Peter Pan pizza, fried chicken and kebab take-a-way.
- During working hours, activity around the neighbouring parade of shops is busy resulting in vehicle parking causing problems to residents on Church Road and Broadoaks Road including blocking my drive.

### Future Environment

I anticipate that should you approve the licence application the following problems will arise viz:

• As I live at **1** Broadoaks Road, it is highly likely that irresponsible drivers

frequenting the new 'bar' will block in my car even though there is a white line on the highway indicating that my driveway should be kept clear at all times.

- The 'quiet' neighbourhood will be disturbed by noisy and drunk revellers.
- Drunken brawls are likely.
- Extra litter will be a problem as drinkers will discard take-a-way food containers.
- Revellers will use the two nearby passages to urinate in, one behind the parade of shops off Broadoaks Road and one at the rear of the Nik Naks shop ajoining my property, 1 Broadoaks Road.
- The presence of the bar next door to the Nitsav general store could impact on the viability of the business.

#### Dear Sirs,

Please accept this Representation in letter format in good time for the deadline date. I would be very grateful for an acknowledgement that this objection has been received and will be fully considered as a non vexatious representation at the Licensing Hearing which I wish to attend, as appropriate.

Firstly it is difficult to envisage quite what the resulting business will be. Nevertheless, the prospect of additional noise, the timing of the noise and the added traffic congestion and possible litter are worrying the nearby neighbourhood.

As a near residential neighbour to the premises the family have various concerns regarding the above including our peaceful enjoyment of our home.

### Public Safety: Parking

Considering the hours of business that the Application seeks, there will inevitably be increased traffic to and from the site and increased parking needed.

Church Road is a very busy road giving access through to Partington, Lymm and beyond, eventually to the motorways and likewise the opposite way into Urmston town centre, Sale, Altrincham, Stretford and Manchester, it is a busy artery.

The location of the Application premises is on a shopping parade which I know to be already a very precarious and dynamic junction of Church Road, Barnfield and Broadoak Road, both as a driver and a pedestrian.

Despite the various parking restriction notices, in particular immediately outside our home, large delivery vehicles and car owners constantly park unchallenged and this blocks the view when trying to get out of the drive safely. Pedestrians fare no better in trying to cross the busy road which is basically a staggered crossroads. Trying to cross the road on foot is very difficult at all times

The parking provision is severely overwhelmed throughout the day and into the evening 6 days out of 7. It is envisaged by neighbours that if the Application is successful, it will lead to further heavy congestion in this attractive residential area, in and around the Barnfield / Church Road interface.

#### Public Nuisance: Noise

The parade of shops is a traditional daytime provision and most are closed by <u>5.30pm</u> with the exception of the Chemist and the Grocery Store, which close sometime later. It is only after this time that the residents can really enjoy their homes in relative peace and quiet, *apart from the noisy cars make their way unchecked for excess speed and excess noise along Church Rd from time to time and of course the First Responders with sirens activated.* 

The prospect of a business continuing on after this time, as indicated in the Application viz. 12 noon to 11 p.m. with noisy, perhaps inebriated customers leaving the premises late at night slamming car / taxi doors, leading to the disturbance of local residents

The character of the shopping parade is of a typical out of town provision and not best suited to a business of

this nature. There is a groundswell of feeling that this would be much better suited located in the busier location of Urmston town centre, where it could fit in much better with the other existing offerings there and where local authority measures and surveillance, which we do not routinely enjoy here locally would apply e.g. cctv, traffic wardens . It would be most out of character for this quiet, much sought after residential location.

#### <u>Litter</u>

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Section 11

For many years we have been plagued by litter from the existing nearby 'take aways'- half eaten meals, empty spirit bottles, drinks cans, food trays, cutlery etc. I routinely in the past collected a full polybag each day and put it into the grey bin, until I was told to stop.

We are a target in being the ideal walking distance from Pinocchio's, exactly the time it takes to eat a meal and discard the wrappings.

Any additional litter would further exacerbate an already untenable situation

#### Local Considerations:

- The very popular Roebuck pub is a short walk away.
- In addition a very well stocked off-licence is open long hours at the Church Road /Stretford Road
  junction, as are three further popular restaurants and two take-aways just round the corner onto Croft Banks Road.
- The busy grocers shop next door serves off-licence beers, wines and spirits.
- Three established 'take-away ' businesses operate further along the road, two open well into the evening.

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It is difficult to see where the demand for an additional provision of the type imagined will come from. I would be obliged if the committee would consider this serious Objection most carefully.

Dear David

I write to respond to the concerns raised regarding the new establishment in Urmston that we are proposing, which would be on the ground floor of <u>192 Church Road</u>. As you are aware I intend to live above the cafe bar if granted a license.

We are proposing to open this new establishment early next year and the concept which we are looking to adopt has proven successful in a number of other villages. The establishment would be a small local cafe/wine bar that would also offer craft ales and hot beverages, such as tea and coffee. I feel that the proposed plans would complement the area well and the concept that we are offering would be a real difference to the existing pubs and bars in the area.

We are looking to offer a modern concept to Urmston residents, which would enable people to relax on seating either indoors or outdoors, socialise and experience wines, craft beers and hot beverages from around the world. The establishment would play low volume ambient music and we would have limited opening hours. This establishment would be open from Mon - Wed 12pm - 11pm and Thursday to Sunday 11am - 11pm. We would offer regular wine tasting events, which would aim to engage the locals and have the various wines available to purchase. We have experience of running similar establishments and locals have enjoyed the sense of community that it bought to the area, we want this to be an establishment where people feel welcome and can come in for a friendly chat.

We understand that there have been some concerns regarding this new establishment opening in Urmston which we are disappointed to hear about, however we would like to reassure local residents that our plans would not be to introduce anything that is detrimental to the local community and residents in fact quite the opposite. We are targeting a certain clientele with an appreciation for good quality wines and craft ales, at the high end of the drinks market.

We would like to address the concerns raised by the four local residents, and we interpret the key points to be:

Litter

• We will not be serving takeaway food and so no there will be no packaging to dispose of, however we will provide a bin at the entrance to the establishment that would be emptied regularly. Keeping the area is a priority in attracting customers.

### Public nuisance

- Noisy and drunk revellers we intend to have CCTV and signs up on doorways asking for people to consider local residents when leaving the vicinity. We would work closely with local authorities to ensure minimal disruption. As part of my personal licence I have a duty of care to refuse anyone deemed to have consumed excessive alcohol and whom may cause unnecessary disruption and inappropriate behaviour towards others.
- No fire safety for people living in the flats above the establishment complies with all current building and fire safety regulation and I plan to live in the flat above the establishment. The establishment would be fitted with fire alarms and extinguishers.
- People smoking outside external ashtrays will be provided for clientele and furniture will be taken inside after 9pm. Cleaning will be undertaken continuously throughout the opening hours. Part of the appeal of the establishment will be the cleanliness both internally and externally.
- Residents living in the flats above and associated noise I will be living as resident directly over the bar and would be also concerned about associated noise, however I intend as detailed above to not create any disturbance to local residents and to ensure that any music that is played is low volume and ambient. We would ensure that all clientele would be prohibited from drinking outside the premises after 9pm each day. As already agreed with Trafford BC
- Drug dealers in a local flat I am unaware that there is a drug dealer living in a local flat and I would hope that this would be dealt with by the relevant local authorities.

### Parking

- Increased parking- in my opinion there is sufficient parking available on Church Road particularly after 6pm.
- Public Safety with increased traffic and congestion we anticipate that there would be a limited impact on the traffic and congestion, we would be a local establishment that people would walk from and we would hope that people would not drink and drive.
- Precarious junction crossing the road is difficult there is a pedestrian crossing further up Church Road which can be used by clients from the establishment.
- Unloading issue there is no unloading issue as we have a facility to off load to the rear of the premises as we do now as a hire shop

### <u>Noise</u>

- We have an agreement with Trafford Borough Council's Licencing Department, that no drinks can either be taken outside of the premises or consumed outside the premises after 9pm.
- We intend to have no impact on the quiet residential environment, I intend to live above the proposed establishment and it is in my interest to keep noise to an absolute minimum. We propose to play low key acoustic/ambient relaxing background music.

### Impact on other businesses

• Bars already in the area impacting on the viability of the business – we have done significant market research which has provided positive feedback from the majority of people. People are excited by the concept, the establishment would act as a community hub for people to meet up in the day and evening whether it be for a coffee, good quality wine or craft beer. This establishment would have a positive impact on other businesses in the local area, for example, people coming in for a coffee may then go to the local shops next door or people may come in for a glass of wine before going for something to eat in the Roebuck. The establishment would be a unique and diverse addition to Urmston and would complement the area well.

As someone who is going to be a resident, neighbour and part of this community, I would welcome the opportunity to meet local residents and discuss the establishment in more detail and address the four people with concerns. I would be happy to arrange either individual or a group meeting so we can find some common ground. After all, we all want to improve our local area and I would like your input on how we can achieve this.
