Report Title

APPLICATION FOR THE GRANT OF A NEW PREMISES LICENCE UNDER S17 LICENSING ACT 2003 AT FIBBER MAGEE'S, 162 NORTHENDEN ROAD, SALE, M33 3HE

Summary

Under S18(4) of the Licensing Act 2003, Members are requested to determine an application for a new premises licence in respect of Fibber Magee's, 162 Northenden Road, Sale, M33 3HE having regard to representations received and the requirement to promote the four licensing objectives.

Recommendation(s)

The following options are open to the Licensing Sub-Committee;

- (i) To grant the application in full and on the terms and conditions contained within the application to include any applicable mandatory conditions.
- (ii) To grant the application as above, modified to such an extent as considered appropriate to satisfy any relevant representations and promote the licensing objectives; or
- (iii) To reject the application.

1.0 APPLICATION

- **1.1** A premises licence is required in respect of any premises where it is intended to conduct one or more of the four licensable activities, these being:
 - The sale of alcohol
 - The supply of alcohol (in respect of a club)
 - Regulated entertainment
 - The provision of late night refreshment

This application was submitted by, Kuit Steinart Levy LLP in respect of Fiber Magee's, 162 Northenden Road, Sale, M33 3HE.

1.2 The applicant has applied for the following hours:

Live Music - Indoors

Sunday - Thursday 12:00 - 23:00 Friday & Saturday 12:00 - 01:00

From the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to the terminal hour for New Year's Day.

Recorded Music - Indoors

Sunday - Thursday 12:00 - 23:00 Friday & Saturday 12:00 - 01:00

From the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to the terminal hour for New Year's Day.

Late Night Refreshment - Indoors

Friday & Saturday 23:00 - 01:00

From the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to the terminal hour for New Year's Day.

Alcohol - On & Off

Sunday - Thursday 12:00 - 23:00 Friday & Saturday 12:00 - 01:00

From the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to the terminal hour for New Year's Day.

Opening Hours

Sunday - Thursday 08:00 - 23:30 Friday & Saturday 08:00 - 01:30

From the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to the terminal hour for New Year's Day.

1.3 The application has been properly made and all procedures correctly followed. The application including amended operating schedule has been attached as

Appendix A. Photographs of the blue notice in place and copy of newspaper advert are attached as **Appendix B**.

2.0 BACKGROUND AND HISTORY OF PREMISES

2.1 The applicant has described the premises as: "An Irish Pub".

3.0 OPERATING SCHEDULE

3.1 The operating schedule is completed by the applicant and contains additional measures to illustrate how they propose to promote the four licensing objectives as required by the Licensing Act 2003. They are listed below and will be attached as conditions to any licence as may be granted:

The Prevention of Crime and Disorder

- 1. The premises shall operate a CCTV system that complies with the minimum requirements of the GMP Licensing Team.
- 2. The premises licence holder must ensure that:
- (i) Cameras are located within the premises to cover all public areas (not including the toilets) and all entrances and exits;
- (ii) The system records clear images enabling the identification of individuals:
- (iii) All recorded footage is securely retained for a minimum period of twentyeight days;
- (iv) The CCTV system operates at all times the premises are open for licensable activities:
- (v) All equipment must have constant and accurate time and date generation;
- (vi) The CCTV system is fitted with security functions to prevent recordings being tampered with;
- (vii) There is at least one member of trained staff at the premises during opening hours able to provide viewable copies on request to police or authorised local authority officers as soon as is reasonably practicable in accordance with all relevant data protection legislation.
- 3. SIA registered door supervisors shall be employed at the premises in accordance with a risk assessment, to be carried out by the DPS.
- 4. When employed, all door supervisors on duty at the premises must correctly display their current SIA accreditation and be briefed on their responsibilities and relevant company operating procedures before they commence duty.
- 5. When employed, all door supervisors shall wear high visibility armbands.
- 6. When employed, a register of door supervisors shall be maintained at the premises and shall include:
- (i) The SIA registration number of door staff on duty;
- (ii) the identity of each member of door staff;
- (iii) the dates and times the door staff are on duty.

- 7. The Designated Premises Supervisor must have attended a CT Awareness training session delivered by CTPNW-trained personnel as soon as is reasonably practicable. In all cases, within 28 days of a new Designated Premises Supervisor being named on the licence, they must have registered to attend a course and be able to provide evidence of this if requested by a police officer or authorised officer of Trafford Council.
- 8. Open containers of alcohol shall not be removed from the premises, including into the smoking area the front of the premises.
- 9. All staff authorised to sell alcohol shall be trained in:
- (i) Relevant age restrictions in respect of products
- (ii) Prevention of underage sales
- (iii) Prevention of proxy sales
- (iv) Maintenance of the refusals log
- (v) Recognising signs of drunkenness and vulnerability
- (vi) How overservice of alcohol impacts on the four objectives of the Licensing Act 2003
- (vii) How to refuse service
- (viii) Action to be taken in the event of an emergency, including the preservation of a crime scene and reporting an incident to the emergency services
- (ix) The conditions in force under this licence.

This training shall be documented and repeated at 6 monthly intervals. Training records shall be made available for inspection upon request by a police officer or an authorised officer of Trafford Council.

10. A refusals record must be kept at the premises which details all refusals to sell alcohol. This record must include the date and time of the incident, the name of the staff member who refused the sale, and the reason the sale was refused. All entries must be made within 24 hours of the refusal. The record must be made available for inspection and copying within a reasonable time of a request by an officer of a Responsible Authority.

Public Safety

- 11. The premises licence holder shall ensure that at all times when the public is present there is an appropriate number of competent person(s) able to administer first aid, that an adequate and appropriate supply of first aid equipment and materials is available on the premises, and that adequate records are maintained in relation to the supply of any first aid treatment.
- 12. Regular safety checks shall be carried out by staff.
- 13. Management shall liaise with the Fire Authority as necessary to ensure compliance with all necessary fire regulations.
- 14. Any and all of the following incidents must be noted including pertinent details and, as appropriate, reported promptly so that investigations can be made and action taken:

- a. alleged crimes reported to the venue or by the venue to the police
- b. ejections of patrons
- c. complaints received
- d. incidents of disorder
- e. seizures of drugs, offensive weapons, fraudulent ID or other items
- f. faults in the CCTV system, searching equipment or scanning equipment
- g. visit by a responsible authority or emergency service
- 15. Incident logs (which may be kept electronically) must be kept at the premises for at least 6 months and must be made available on request to the police or an authorised officer of the licensing authority.
- 16. The premises shall maintain public liability insurance.

The Prevention of Public Nuisance

- 17. Noise from amplified music or voices shall not be such as to cause a noise nuisance to occupants of nearby premises.
- 18. No noise shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.
- 19. There shall be no noise or odours caused by the kitchen extraction equipment that gives rise to a nuisance.
- 20. The exterior of the building shall be cleared of litter at regular intervals.
- 21. Notices will be positioned at the exits to the building requesting customers to leave in a quiet manner.
- 22. All external doors and windows must be kept shut at all times when regulated entertainment is being provided, save for normal access and egress.
- 23. A Dispersal and Smoking Policy will be implemented and adhered to (see attached).
- 24. The emptying of bins into skips, and refuse collections will not take place between 11pm and 7am.
- 25. Deliveries to the premises will not take place between 11pm and 7am.
- 26. All waste shall be properly presented and placed out for collection no earlier than 30 minutes before the scheduled collection times.

The Protection of Children From Harm

27. The Challenge 25 scheme must be operated to ensure that any person who appears to be under the age of 25 shall provide documented proof that he/she is over 18 years of age. Proof of age shall only comprise a passport, photo card

driving licence, an EU/EEA national ID card or similar document, an HM Forces warrant card, a card bearing the PASS hologram, or any electronic or biometric age verification technology approved by the licensing authority.

- 28. The premises shall display prominent signage indicating that the Challenge 25 scheme is in operation.
- 29. The premises shall display prominent signage indicating that it is an offence to buy or attempt to buy alcohol for a person who is under 18 and for a person under the age of 18 to buy or attempt to buy alcohol.
- 30.Staff training will include the Challenge 25 Policy and its operation. In particular, staff shall be trained to take such action as is necessary to prevent the sale of alcohol to persons over the age of 18 where those customers are engaged in the distribution of alcohol to persons under the age of 18. The training must be given to a new member of staff before they commence employment and all staff must receive refresher training every 6 months.
- 3.2 The following conditions have been agreed in addition to the above conditions between the applicant and the Environmental Health officer:
 - 31. The operator shall implement the noise mitigation measures advised within the approved Noise Impact Assessment.
 - 32. The operator shall implement the arrangements described within the approved Noise Management Plan.

4.0 **CONSULTATION**

- 4.1 The responsible authorities included in consultation are; Greater Manchester Police, Greater Manchester Fire & Rescue, Environmental Health & Pollution Control, Building Control, Health and Safety Team, Home Office Immigration Enforcement, Planning Department, Safeguarding Children Team, Trading Standards and Public Health.
- **4.2** Of those consultees identified in paragraph 4.1, no representations were received.
- **4.3** 20 representations were received from members of the public against the application, attached as **Appendix C**.
- **4.4** 14 representations were received from members of the public in favour of the application, attached as **Appendix D**.
- **4.5** A copy of the report and the representations received has been sent to the applicant.
- 4.6 Those that have made a representation have been informed of the time and date of the Licensing Sub-Committee meeting and have been informed of their right to attend.

5.0 LEGAL CONSIDERATIONS

- 5.1 Conditions may only be attached to a Premises Licence where they are deemed appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives. They must be proportionate and not duplicate any existing provisions contained in other legislation. The justification behind a refusal or the attachment of conditions must be given to the applicant.
- 5.2 The Sub-Committee is advised that any findings on any issues of fact should be on the balance of probabilities and any decision should be based on the individual merits of the application.
- 5.3 The Sub-Committee, in arriving at its decision; must have regard to relevant provisions of national guidance and its own statement of licensing policy and reasons should be given for any departure.
- **5.4** There is a right of appeal to the Magistrates Court within 21 days from the date the Applicant is notified of the decision of the Licensing Sub-Committee.

NOTES ON DEMONSTRATING ENTITLEMENT TO WORK IN THE UK

Entitlement to work/immigration status for individual applicants and applications from partnerships which are not limited liability partnerships:

A licence may not be held by an individual or an individual in a partnership who is resident in the UK who:

- does not have the right to live and work in the UK; or
- is subject to a condition preventing him or her from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

Any premises licence issued in respect of an application made on or after 6 April 2017 will become invalid if the holder ceases to be entitled to work in the UK.

Applicants must demonstrate that they have an entitlement to work in the UK and are not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity. They do this in one of two ways: 1) by providing with this application copies or scanned copies of the documents listed below (which do not need to be certified), or 2) by providing their 'share code' to enable the licensing authority to carry out a check using the Home Office online right to work checking service (see below).

Documents which demonstrate entitlement to work in the UK

- An expired or current passport showing the holder, or a person named in the passport as the child of the

- A current passport endorsed to show that the holder is exempt from immigration control, is allowed to stay
 indefinitely in the UK, has the right of abode in the UK, or has no time limit on their stay in the UK.
- A current Immigration Status Document issued by the Home Office to the holder with an endorsement indicating that the named person is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK or has no time limit on their stay in the UK, when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A birth or adoption certificate issued in the UK, when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A birth or adoption certificate issued in the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man or Ireland when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A certificate of registration or naturalisation as a British citizen, when produced in combination with an
 official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a
 Government agency or a previous employer.

- A current passport endorsed to show that the holder is allowed to stay in the UK and is currently allowed to
 work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a
 licensable activity.
- A current Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder which indicates that the named person can currently stay in the UK and is allowed to work relation to the carrying on of a licensable activity.
- A current Pesidence Card issued by the Home Office to a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights or residence.
- A current Immigration Status Document containing a photograph issued by the Home Office to the holder with an endorsement indicating that the named person may stay in the UK, and is allowed to work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A Certificate of Application, less than 6 months old, issued by the Home Office under regulation 18(3) or 20(2) of the Immigration (European Economic Area) Regulations 2016, to a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence.
- Peasonable evidence that the person has an outstanding application to vary their permission to be in the UK
 with the Home Office such as the Home Office acknowledgement letter or proof of postage evidence, or
 reasonable evidence that the person has an appeal or administrative review pending on an immigration
 decision, such as an appeal or administrative review reference number.
- Reasonable evidence that a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence in exercising treaty rights in the UK including:-
 - evidence of the applicant's own identity such as a passport,
 - evidence of their relationship with the European Economic Area family member e.g. a marriage certificate, civil partnership certificate or birth certificate, and
 - evidence that the European Economic Area national has a right of permanent residence in the UK or is one of the following if they have been in the UK for more than 3 months:
 - (i) working e.g. employment contract, wage slips, letter from the employer,
 - (ii) self-employed e.g. contracts, invoices, or audited accounts with a bank,
 - (iii) studying e.g. letter from the school, college or university and evidence of sufficient funds; or
 - (iv) self-sufficient e.g. bank statements.

Family members of European Economic Area nationals who are studying or financially independent must also provide evidence that the European Economic Area national and any family members hold comprehensive sickness insurance in the UK. This can include a private medical insurance policy, an EHIC card or an S1, S2 or S3 form.

Original documents must not be sent to licensing authorities. If the document copied is a passport, a copy of the following pages should be provided:-

- (i) any page containing the holder's personal details including nationality;
- (ii) any page containing the holder's photograph;
- (iii) any page containing the holder's signature;
- (iv) any page containing the date of expiry; and
- (v) any page containing information indicating the holder has permission to enter or remain in the UK and is permitted to work.

If the document is not a passport, a copy of the whole document should be provided.

Your right to work will be checked as part of your licensing application and this could involve us checking your immigration status with the Home Office. We may otherwise share information with the Home Office. Your licence application will not be determined until you have complied with this guidance.

Home Office online right to work checking service

As an alternative to providing a copy of the documents listed above, applicants may demonstrate their right to work by allowing the licensing authority to carry out a check with the Home Office online right to work checking service.

To demonstrate their right to work via the Home Office online right to work checking service, applicants should include in this application their 9-digit share code (provided to them upon accessing the service at https://www.gov.uk/prove-right-to-work) which, along with the applicant's date of birth (provided within this application), will allow the licensing authority to carry out the check.

In order to establish the applicant's right to work, the check will need to indicate that the applicant is allowed to work in the United Kingdom and is not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

- Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
- Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Poman
 wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not
 exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or
 wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an
 indoor sporting event.
- Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - o any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.

In all cases, within 28 days of a new Designated Premises Supervisor being named on the licence, they must have registered to attend a course and be able to provide evidence of this if requested by a police officer or authorised officer of Trafford Council.
- 8. Open containers of alcohol shall not be removed from the premises, including into the smoking area the front of the premises.
- 9. All staff authorised to sell alcohol shall be trained in:
 - (i) Relevant age restrictions in respect of products
 - (ii) Prevention of underage sales
 - (iii) Prevention of proxy sales
 - (iv) Maintenance of the refusals log
 - (v) Recognising signs of drunkenness and vulnerability
 - (vi) How overservice of alcohol impacts on the four objectives of the Licensing Act 2003
 - (vii) How to refuse service
 - Action to be taken in the event of an emergency, including the preservation of a (viii) crime scene and reporting an incident to the emergency services

(ix) The conditions in force under this licence.

This training shall be documented and repeated at 6 monthly intervals. Training records shall be made available for inspection upon request by a police officer or an authorised officer of Trafford Council.

10. A refusals record must be kept at the premises which details all refusals to sell alcohol. This record must include the date and time of the incident, the name of the staff member who refused the sale, and the reason the sale was refused. All entries must be made within 24 hours of the refusal. The record must be made available for inspection and copying within a reasonable time of a request by an officer of a Responsible Authority.

B) Public Safety

- 1. The premises licence holder shall ensure that at all times when the public is present there is an appropriate number of competent person(s) able to administer first aid, that an adequate and appropriate supply of first aid equipment and materials is available on the premises, and that adequate records are maintained in relation to the supply of any first aid treatment.
- 2. Regular safety checks shall be carried out by staff.
- 3. Management shall liaise with the Fire Authority as necessary to ensure compliance with all necessary fire regulations.
- 4. Any and all of the following incidents must be noted including pertinent details and, as appropriate, reported promptly so that investigations can be made and action taken:
 - a. alleged crimes reported to the venue or by the venue to the police
 - b. ejections of patrons
 - c. complaints received
 - d. incidents of disorder
 - e. seizures of drugs, offensive weapons, fraudulent ID or other items
 - f. faults in the CCTV system, searching equipment or scanning equipment
 - g. visit by a responsible authority or emergency service
- 5. Incident logs (which may be kept electronically) must be kept at the premises for at least 6 months and must be made available on request to the police or an authorised officer of the licensing authority.
- 6. The premises shall maintain public liability insurance.

C) The Prevention of Public Nuisance

- 1. Noise from amplified music or voices shall not be such as to cause a noise nuisance to occupants of nearby premises.
- 2. No noise shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.
- 3. There shall be no noise or odours caused by the kitchen extraction equipment that gives rise to a nuisance.
- 4. The exterior of the building shall be cleared of litter at regular intervals.
- 5. Notices will be positioned at the exits to the building requesting customers to leave in a quiet manner.

- 6. All external doors and windows must be kept shut at all times when regulated entertainment is being provided, save for normal access and egress.
- 7. A Dispersal and Smoking Policy will be implemented and adhered to (see attached).
- 8. The emptying of bins into skips, and refuse collections will not take place between 11pm and 7am.
- 9. Deliveries to the premises will not take place between 11pm and 7am.
- 10. All waste shall be properly presented and placed out for collection no earlier than 30 minutes before the scheduled collection times.

D) The Protection of Children From Harm

- 1. The Challenge 25 scheme must be operated to ensure that any person who appears to be under the age of 25 shall provide documented proof that he/she is over 18 years of age. Proof of age shall only comprise a passport, photo card driving licence, an EU/EEA national ID card or similar document, an HM Forces warrant card, a card bearing the PASS hologram, or any electronic or biometric age verification technology approved by the licensing authority.
- 2. The premises shall display prominent signage indicating that the Challenge 25 scheme is in operation.
- 3. The premises shall display prominent signage indicating that it is an offence to buy or attempt to buy alcohol for a person who is under 18 and for a person under the age of 18 to buy or attempt to buy alcohol.
- 4. Staff training will include the Challenge 25 Policy and its operation. In particular, staff shall be trained to take such action as is necessary to prevent the sale of alcohol to persons over the age of 18 where those customers are engaged in the distribution of alcohol to persons under the age of 18. The training must be given to a new member of staff before they commence employment and all staff must receive refresher training every 6 months.







I have a shop one door away from the premises and I don't want to have to deal with intoxicated patrons later on into the evening.

I live above my shop at so only one property away and the noise from the road is enough to disturb sleep on some occasions so how would a live music venue that's open till 0130 effect us, it's crazy to even think that it won't directly impact the residents who live above or opposite. Noise from late arriving and late leaving, shouting antisocial behaviour, taxis coming and going, car doors slamming, deliveries which already effect the people living here when Greggs deliver in the late/early hours of the morning, how on earth can the landlord think to ask for a 0130 live music opening. Our ability to sleep and not be disturbed will be damaged every single night. We can hear the Temple pub music from our bedroom window and that's a fair way off. Litter will also be an issue and that's already a major point in the village with so many food takeaways. The villagers have been volunteering to do regular litter picks and this addition will only make this worse.

It goes without saying more intoxicated people and for way longer hours in the middle of a small family village will make people feel unsafe. During the sale moor strategy nexus plans when local residents were asked, the safety of children was a large point, safety on the road, using the village, not feeling intimidated and this will only rise and drive families and children and elderly people away from our village.

We have been in the village since 2014 and watched the addition of family based businesses. This can only push visitors away and intimidate the already established users. Many residents and business owners have used innapropriate when discussing the proposed plans and I agree. Sale Moor village doesn't need or want a late opening night/early moming night club as the damage done all round will only be a massive negative to a lovely family community based area.



Traffic is a major issue with accidents for cyclists and cars along with HGVS which are a daily occurrence. Add to that more footfall, more traffic and then intoxicated people even during the day let alone at night will massively increase the risks. Obviously intoxicated people are going to raise the amount of anti social behaviour directly in the centre of a quiet family village which could lead to higher crimes.

Noise, litter, antisocial behaviour, crime, the local shops will be dealing with intoxicated people during trading hours and the residents who live here will have to deal with them at night. I live very close and the noise of the live music will have a higher impact on my life, I'm making my choices at school next year and to have a busy pub playing loud live music until 0130 will Inpact my sleep and time that I'm studying at home. I also sometimes have to go to my other families homes during evening hours and this will be effected as I'll feel threatened having to walk past a pub. Litter is a major issue in our village with regular litter picks and this will only add to the problem and make the village less appealing, local business who provide for younger children will be effect because who would want to come to a village where drunk people are here from early morning to the following early morning.

I will not feel comfortable using the village at all if a fully fledged 0130am pub is literally next door. I won't be comfortable using the village to shop, commute through or walk to friends or families houses. I won't feel comfortable coming home from school and walking through the village. Lots of mums and dads bring small children to shop here and they won't want to do this if there is intoxicated people so close.

It seems very odd to want to open a pub in such a strange setting. It will change the dynamic of the whole village and make it an unpleasant experience. Especially for children and teenagers. I live above my Dads shop and we can already hear the two pubs that are close let alone one door an away. This will effect my life



closing hours only differ to the nearby Legh Arms pub by +1 hour Fri and Sat (midnight vs 1am), with midweek having the same closing time so no great concern although admittedly we are not immediate neighbours. We have young children and have no major concern regards safety or negative "impact on family environment" (we do not consider the village to have much of a family offering as it stands), especially given there are already two pubs in the immediate vicinity. We therefore question what issue the proposed venue would pose in a safety regard nighttime-wise, that does not already exist. This could also apply to the notion of possible damage to others' and communal property. On another positive note, we see that all-day food will be offered which will be a welcome addition vs lack of variety in current 'dine-in' options in the village, particularly in the evening. The main element we can sympathise with in the displayed notice is noise concern for immediate neighbours. In this regard however, both existing local pubs have had karaoke on some evenings. We also sympathise with the argument of particularly long drinking hours with Wetherspoon-style early opening, but would expect the venue to police this to stop excessive drinking during the day and ban any trouble-makers, because anti-social behaviour in the village is not a current problem and will not be tolerated.
