Report Title

OBJECTION FROM ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH TO A TEMPORARY EVENT NOTICE ISSUED FOR THE TRAFFORD, 699 CHESTER ROAD, STRETFORD, M16 0GW.

Summary

To consider whether or not to accept the objections from Environmental Health and to decide whether to issue a counter notice under section 105 of the Licensing Act 2003.

Having regard to the objection notice, consider whether it is necessary to accept the objection, and if the authority does accept the objection, to give the premises user a counter notice under section 105 of the Licensing Act 2003.

1.0 BACKGROUND

- 1.1 Part 5 of the Licensing Act 2003 provides a system of permitted temporary activities, under which licensable activities can be carried out on a temporary basis (for a period not exceeding 168 hours) without the need for a premises licence or a club premises certificate.
- 1.2 These activities can take place on any premises by the authority of a Temporary Event Notice (TEN) given by an individual, a 'premises user', to the relevant Licensing Authority.
- 1.3 No permission is required from the Licensing Authority and only the Police and Environmental Health may intervene with a view to preventing such an event going ahead or to modify the arrangements for it.
- 1.4 A Temporary Event Notice must be given to the authority at least 10 working days before the event and a copy of the notice must also be given to the Police and Environmental Health.
- 1.5 Where the Police or Environmental Health are of the view that allowing the event to proceed would undermine the licensing objectives, they must, within three working days of receiving the TEN, give an objection notice to the premises user and the licensing authority, giving reasons for their decision.
- 1.6 If the Police or Environmental Health object to a TEN, the licensing authority must hold a hearing to determine whether or not it accepts the objections. Where the authority accepts the objections, it must issue a counter notice to the premises user in which case the event cannot proceed.

2.0 TEMPORARY EVENT NOTICE

- 2.1 On the 5th June 2024, the Premises Licence holder Blind Tiger Inns on behalf of Mr Christopher Ramsden served a Temporary Event Notice on the Licensing Authority for premises known as The Trafford, 699 Chester Road, Stretford, M16 0GW, a copy of which is attached as **Appendix A**.
- 2.2 Part of the premises currently benefits from a Premise Licence, PL000249 attached as **Appendix B**.
- 2.3 Details of Temporary Event Notice:

2.4 On 5th June 2024 an objection was received from Environmental Health. A copy of which is attached at **Appendix C**.

3.0 **OPTIONS**

3.1 The TEN can be modified at any time before a hearing is held with the agreement of the premise user and the relevant authority which has objected by changing the details of the parts of the premises that are to be used for the event, the description of the nature of the intended activities or their duration.

3.2 The 2003 Act provides that only the Licensing Authority can impose conditions to a TEN from the existing conditions on the premises licence or club premises certificate at the venue. The Licensing Authority can impose conditions to a TEN from the existing conditions on the premises licence or club premise certificate at the venue. The licensing authority can only do so:

- if the police or the EHA have objected to the TEN;
- if that objection has not been withdrawn;
- if there is a licence or certificate in relation to at least a part of the premise and in respect of which the TEN is given;
- and if the licensing authority considers it appropriate for the promotion of licensing objectives to impose one or more conditions.

3.3 The Sub-Committee can impose conditions to a TEN to the extent that they are on the existing premises licence.

3.4 The Sub-Committee is requested to consider the objection notice, and consider whether it is necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives to accept the objection; and if the Licensing Authority does accept the objections, to issue the premises user a counter notice under section 105 of the Licensing Act 2003.

Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions

MANDATORY CONDITIONS

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:
 - (a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises, or
 - (b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended
2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

ADDITIONAL MANDATORY CONDITIONS (28th May 2014)

3. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
4. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1:
 - (a) “duty” is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979
 - (b) “permitted price” is the price found by applying the formula

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

Where

- (i) P is the permitted price
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol

and

- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol
- (c) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or



- (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
 - (d) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
 - (e) “value added tax” means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
5. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
6. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day (“the first day”) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (“the second day”) as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

ADDITIONAL MANDATORY CONDITIONS (1st October 2014)

7. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises
- (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purposes of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises:
- (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to:
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise)
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of

24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective

- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability)
8. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
9. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either:
- (a) a holographic mark
- or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature
10. The responsible person must ensure that:
- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of



alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available

Annex 2 – Conditions Consistent with the Operating Schedule

1. No customers carrying open or sealed bottles shall be admitted to the premises at any time that the premises are open to the public.
2. A sign will be displayed on the premises indicating the standard hours during which the sale of alcohol is permitted.
3. No regulated entertainment of any type shall take place outside the premises in any areas which are within the licence holder's control after 22:00 save for any special event seven days' notice of which has been given to the licensing authority and police.
4. When amplified musical entertainment is taking place inside the premises after 22:00 windows and doors, save for entrance and exit purposes, will be kept shut.
5. A sign will be located at the exit(s) requesting that customers leaving the premises do so quietly and with consideration to neighbours. No one under the age of 16 will be allowed to enter or remain on the premises after 22:00 save on Christmas Eve and New Years Eve.
6. Anyone who appears to be under the age of 18 and who is attempting to buy alcohol must be required to produce proof of age before such a sale is made.
7. A digital Closed Circuit Television System (CCTV) will be installed and maintained in good working order and be correctly time and date stamped. The system will incorporate sufficient built-in hard-drive capacity to suit the number of cameras installed.
8. CCTV will be capable of providing pictures of evidential quality in all lighting conditions, particularly facial recognition.
9. Cameras will encompass all ingress and egress to the Premises, the immediate area outside the frontage of the Premises and all areas where the sale/supply of alcohol occurs.
10. The system will record and retain CCTV footage for a minimum of 28 days.
11. The system will record at all times when the Premises are open.
12. The system will incorporate a means of transferring images from the hard-drive to a format that can be played back on a standard desktop computer.
13. The Digital recorder will be password protected to prevent unauthorised access, tampering, or deletion of images.
14. There will be at all times, when the Premises is open, a member of staff on duty with



access to the CCTV system who is trained in the use of the equipment.

15. Upon receipt of a request for a copy of CCTV footage from Police, or Officers or any other Responsible Authority, the member of staff will produce the footage within 24 hours, or less if urgently required for investigations of serious crime.

16. CCTV footage must be made available to be viewed by Greater Manchester Police or an Officer of a Responsible Authority upon request or during an inspection.

17. A zero tolerance towards illegal drugs will operate at all times – Immediate removal from the premises of anyone found or believed to have consumed any drug or psychoactive substance.

18. An operating schedule will be in place regarding the day-to-day operations of the whole licensed area and high-profile events, including all MUFC First Team/International fixtures at Manchester United Football Club, Old Trafford.

19. The operating schedule will be reviewed on a regular basis and any changes in the schedule, relating to prevent crime and disorder to be made in conjunction with Greater Manchester Police.

20. The operating schedule should be reviewed at least every 12 months. When it is referred to, The 'premises' is all licensed areas as shown in the plans.

21. No Rowdy or inconsiderate behaviour will be permitted by customers on the premises that will cause alarm or distress to any persons.

22. No Customers will be allowed to take Alcoholic drinks off the premises in open containers as long as there is an active PSPO in place in Trafford and around the sporting stadium. (Public Space Protection Order).

23. A 'Challenge 25' policy shall be operated on the premises at all times. The policy must be understood by all employees who are involved in the sale of alcohol. The policy will be documented, read and signed by all individuals working at the business who are involved in the sale of alcohol to indicate that they understand it. The policy must require all staff to check the identification of all persons who appear to be less than 25 years of age.

24. Proof of age checks shall be made by examining either a passport, photographic driving licence or PASS approved proof of age card.

25. Clearly visible notices shall be displayed at the entrance, at the point of sale and where the goods are displayed highlighting the operation of the 'Challenge 25' policy. The notices will display details of the operation of the 'Challenge 25' and valid identification policy.

26. Staff training must be provided at least once a year to existing staff, and to all new staff on arrival, on the law relating to underage sales of alcohol products.

27. Written/digital records of all training provided in respect to the law relating to underage sales of alcohol must be kept. Staff to sign and date records to confirm that the training has been received and understood. Record of staff training should be made available/accessible immediately to Authorised Officers of Trafford Council/GMP on request.

28. A refusal log is to be kept to record dates and times of all refusals to sell alcohol to underage persons. A copy of the Refusals Log will be made available immediately upon request of Authorised Officers of Trafford. A log should include a note of ID. A copy of this information will be made available immediately upon request to Authorised Officers of Trafford Council/GMP on request.
