ANNEX 1 - MANDATORY CONDITIONS

1. Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied except during the hours granted on the licence and the following:

New Year's Eve, from the end of licensing hours on New Years Eve to the start of licensing hours on the following day (or, if there are no licensing hours on the following day, midnight on 31st December)

2. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence -

- (a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises, or
- (b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

3. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

4. Where the premises licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, each such individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

ADDITIONAL MANDATORY CONDITIONS (6th April 2010)

5. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

6. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

7. Certain "irresponsible" drinks promotions are banned. An irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children -

- (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to -
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
- (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on -
 - (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
 - (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
- (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.

New Mandatory Licensing Conditions - 1st October 2010

8. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

- (2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

9. The responsible person shall ensure that -

- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures -
- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
- (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

ANNEX 2 - CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE

1. Noise from music and associated source (including DJ's and amplified voices) must not be audible to such an extent that it constitutes a nuisance at any noise sensitive properties.

(Based on IOA Good Practice Guide on the Control of Noise from Pubs and Clubs)

2. Prominent signage about laws relating to children and alcohol will be displayed.
3. Anyone who appears to be under the age of 21 must provide a suitable form of identification such as:

Passport

Photo Card Driving Licence (issued in any EU country)

Proof of age standard schemes (pass), such as citizen card, supported by home office.

4. The premises shall be monitored to ensure that children are not pressuring other customers to buy alcohol on their behalf.

5. There will be co-operation with the police, Pubwatch and the local Licensing Authority.

6. Alcohol may be sold to residents of the hotel and their bona fide guests 24 hours a day.
