June – Crime for assault, the victim in this report is the licensee Dawn Slater. She has witnessed a verbal domestic argument between a male and female, she witnesses the female go into the toilet and she comes out the toilet she notices she looks angry and is concerned for her/that she may have taken drugs in the toilet. She stops her and the female offender pushed SLATER out of the way causing to fall. This is recorded as an assault against SLATER. The female offender then pushed over some glasses/equipment being stored on the kitchen side causing damage. Police attended and matter was resolved by way of restorative justice.

June – Crime for assault, the victim has been asked to leave the pub, the report mentions she was told to stop filming people that were dancing prior to being asked to leave. The female then calls Police from outside that people inside were on/taking drugs and when being escorted out someone kicked her leg, possibly security but she couldn't be sure. She refused all other details, not seen by Police and log was closed. Crime submitted as said someone had kicked her leg on the call.

August 2022 - These two crimes are linked and are one incident. A group of males were stood inside the pub and began arguing, a member of staff went over and asked them to calm down and decided to ask one of the unknown males to leave to prevent escalation. As the male starts to walk out of the pub he picks a ball off the pool table and turns and throws it at the direction of the lads he had been arguing with. The ball hits one of the males on the head, the offender continues his way out the pub and leaves the area, his identity is unknown.

The male who is the victim of this assault is annoyed at being hit by the thrown ball and picks up door stop from the floor which staff remove from his hand, he then picks up a nearby bottle from a table and throws it causing it to smash on floor (staff say this wasn't directed at anyone).

August 2022 – Crime for assault, this occurred outside in the carpark, female was with friends talking/drinking. A male approached her and began talking to her, she knows the male as she is a witness in an unrelated case he is involved in and tells him 'I don't want to be seen talking to you'. Male walks off and short time later approaches female and assaults her by way of hitting her with a glass and punch her, he then runs away. SLATER comes outside as this was in the carpark at around 20:30 hours. Offers first aid and that she will contact Paramedic, victim refuses as she has friends with her in a vehicle. Victim leaves and later that night/following day goes to hospital. Victim reattends the public house and meets SLATER and SLATER shows her the CCTV of the assault which was covered on their external CCTV cameras. SLATER states she can provide this to Police upon request. No charges in the case were brought.

Glass has been part of some of these MO's be it directly in one instance when used to cause injury outside and in two others where glass was broken. A learning point to take away is the collection of glasses when empty needs to be a priority.

There have been no further crime reports linked to the premises / licensable activities since the serious assault in August 2022.
