We are objecting to this Licence variation at 846 Chester Road for the following reasons:

- The variation appears to be for a meeting point fanzone on a match day.
- We are concerned that there is no access to the toilets without leaving the rear of premises and walking down Wesley Street and back into the front of the premises. There are not enough facilities for patrons and could lead to nuisance along Wesley Street and surrounding areas with urinating in the streets, alleyways and parks between the bar and the football ground. Due to significant issues, on a match day with people in and around urinating in the street, we are concerned that this increase in footfall could lead to this type of behaviour, especially with them having to walk to the ground and having no immediate access to a toilet.
- Concern that there is no direct access from inside the premises to the back courtyard, those who are purchasing alcohol (open pint) inside the premises, would be encouraged to walk down a street which inside a PSPO area, which prohibits street drinking in order to enter the fanzone.
- There is no mention of any condition associated to security at the premises and how they will control the patrons coming in and out of the property.
- Point above extends to how are they going to control the numbers of patrons in and out of the courtyard and premises, especially when it is such a tight space with little by way of emergency exit. If a large crowd was to form, especially considering encouragement of being a fanzone, how would they prevent crushing? The applicant has not addressed any of this in their application.

Evidence:

Community Safety prosecuted 19 over 3 matches (average 6.3 per game) for urinating in the street.
