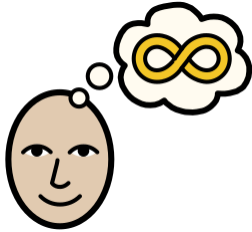


Labour Group Motion: My Vote, My Voice. Charter, 1

40% of people living in the UK don't know that autistic people and learning disabled people have a right to vote



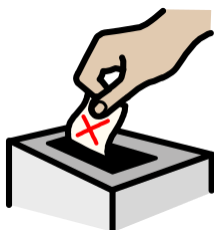
80% of people think polling stations are not accessible to disabled people



Only 12% of disabled voters knew about their legal rights during 2023 local elections

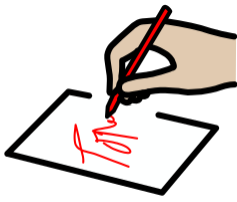


The 2023 local elections had new rules. You now need to bring ID such as a passport or drivers licence with you to vote

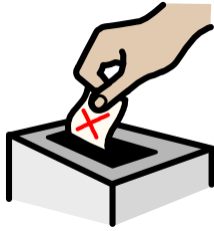


There are going to be lots of important elections in 2024 and every vote should count

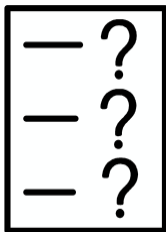
This is why Trafford Council will sign the "My vote, my voice" charter
