1. Background

- 1.1 2 Claremont Road is a former café situated close to the main pedestrianised shopping street of School Road in Sale.

The Premises does not currently benefit from a premises licence.



2 Claremont Rd, Sale M33 7DZ

2. Application for the Grant of a Premises Licence

- 2.1 On 15th July, 2016 the Licensing Section received an application (**Appendix A**) from Michael Plant for the grant of a new premises licence.
- 2.2 The application requests the granting of a premises licence for the Supply of Alcohol, on and off the premises.
- 2.3 The hours requested for the licensable activity on the application are as follows:

Sale of Alcohol (off the premises):

Monday to Sunday : 11:00 – 22:00

2.4 The applicant has complied with all requirements under the application process including advertising the application in a newspaper, advertising by way of public notice at the premises and submitting a copy of the complete application to all Responsible Authorities. The application is deemed to be correctly submitted.

3. Representations



3.1 During the consultation period, two letters of representation were received from local residents (**Appendices B & C**).

3.2 The Committee are respectfully advised that the representations received against the application broadly relate to the Licensing Objectives:

- Prevention of Public Nuisance
- Prevention of Crime and Disorder

3.3 The Members are advised that The Government's Guidance states that it is not sufficient for an objector to simply state that they wish to object, or that they are objecting on noise grounds. A representation should give more detail of the likely impact should the licence be granted.

3.4 It is recommended that, in borderline cases, the benefit of the doubt about any aspect of a representation should be given to the person making that representation. The subsequent hearing would then provide an opportunity for the person or body making the representation to amplify and clarify it.

3.7 The Members are therefore required to determine the relevance of all representations.

3.8 When considering the relevance of any representation the Licensing Sub-Committee must be aware that :

- i. the representation can be from any person or body;
- ii. it must not be repetitious, vexatious or frivolous;
- iii. it must relate to one or more of the licensing objectives.

4. Licensing Policy and Guidance

4.1 The Committee are respectfully referred to the Council's own Licensing Policy relating to the Licensing Act 2003 objectives and to the Secretary of State's Guidance. (Copy available at meeting)

5. Options

5.1 The Sub-Committee to take such steps as they consider necessary for the promotion of the Licensing Objectives in accordance with the provisions of subsection (4) of the Licensing Act 2003. The steps specified are:

5.1.1 To grant the licence subject to-

- Conditions consistent with the operating schedule accompanying the application modified to such extent as the authority considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives, and;
- Any mandatory conditions which must be included under the Licensing Act 2003

5.1.2 to exclude from the scope of the licence any of the licensable activities to which the application relates;

5.1.3 to refuse to specify a person in the licence as the premises supervisor;

5.1.4 to reject the application.

5.2 The Sub-Committee is advised that any findings on any issues of fact should be on the balance of probability and any decision should be based on the individual merits of the application.

5.3 The Sub-Committee, in arriving at its decision, must have regard to relevant provisions of national guidance and its own statement of licensing policy and reasons should be given for any departure.

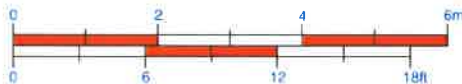
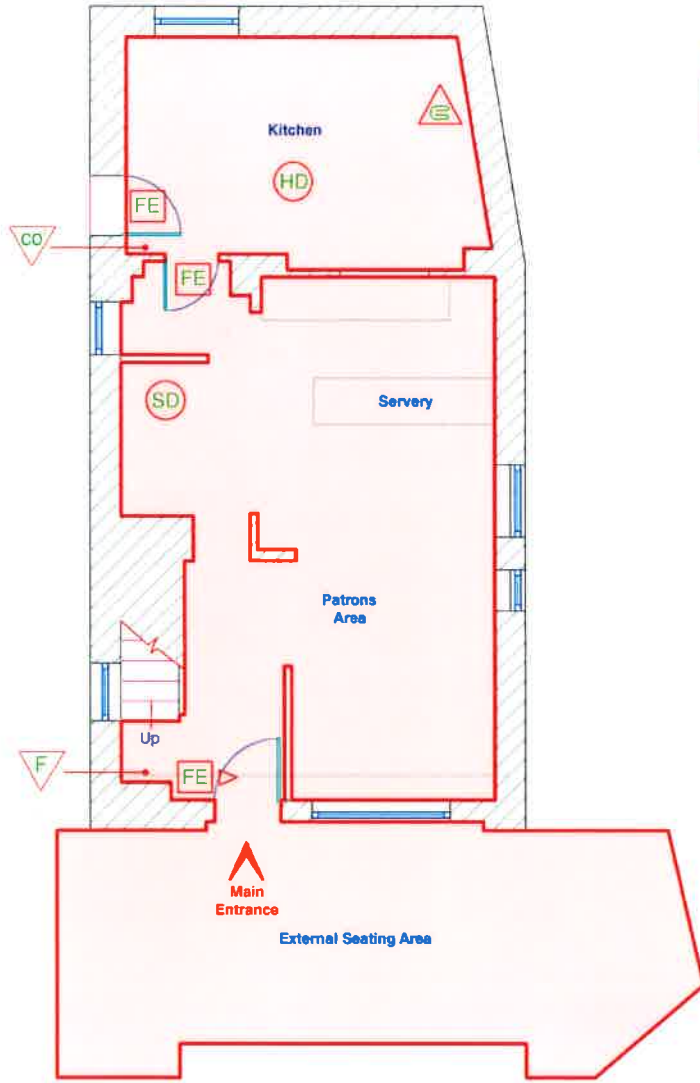

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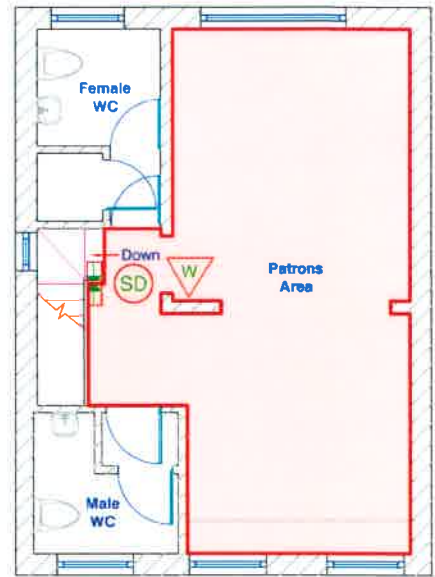

1. Background

- 1.1 173 Canterbury Road, Flixton, Manchester, M41 0SE is a well-established convenience store site which is traded by Martin McColl Limited. The convenience store has been designed to serve both the local community and those from further a-field.

The Premises does not currently benefit from a premises licence.



2. Application for the Grant of a Premises Licence

- 2.1 On 21st July, 2016 the Licensing Section received an application (**Appendix A**) from Martin McColl Limited for the grant of a new premises licence.
- 2.2 The application requests the granting of a premises licence for the provide Supply of Alcohol, off the premises only.
- 2.3 The hours requested for the licensable activity on the application are as follows:

Sale of Alcohol (off the premises):

Monday to Sunday : 06:00 – 23:00

- 2.4 The applicant has complied with all requirements under the application process including advertising the application in a newspaper, advertising by way of public notice at the premises and submitting a copy of the complete application to all Responsible Authorities. The application is deemed to be correctly submitted.

3. Representations



- 3.1 During the consultation period, two letters of representation were received from local residents (**Appendices B & C**).
- 3.2 Also during the consultation period the Licensing Section received two petitions submitted by local residents (**Appendices D & E**).
- 3.3 The Committee are respectfully advised that the individual representations received against the application broadly relate to the Licensing Objectives:
- Prevention of Public Nuisance
 - Prevention of Crime and Disorder
- 3.4 The Members are advised that The Government's Guidance states that it is not sufficient for an objector to simply state that they wish to object, or that they are objecting on noise grounds. A representation should give more detail of the likely impact should the licence be granted.
- 3.5 It is recommended that, in borderline cases, the benefit of the doubt about any aspect of a representation should be given to the person making that representation. The subsequent hearing would then provide an opportunity for the person or body making the representation to amplify and clarify it.
- 3.6 The Committee are respectfully advised that The Licensing Section, in accepting a petition, will deal directly with the lead petitioner who is advised as follows :
- We ask that the instigator of the petition identifies themselves as a central point of contact, as we may need to make contact in order to verify certain matters and if we are unable to do so this could invalidate the petition

- Each page of the petition should contain information as to the purpose of the petition so that all persons know what they are signing.
- Full names and addresses for each signatory must be provided.
- All signatories must be made aware that where representations are made and not withdrawn a copy of the petition will be supplied to the applicant and a copy will be contained within the committee papers.
- This Licensing Authority will not write to each signatory separately but instead, expects that the instigator of the petition will advise each signatory of the hearing date and the final outcome of the application.
- It is also expected that an instigator will represent signatories at the hearing and will speak for them.

3.7 The Members are therefore required to determine the relevance of all representations and petitions.

3.8 When considering the relevance of any representation the Licensing Sub-Committee must be aware that :

- i. the representation can be from any person or body;

We write to inform that we strongly object to the proposal to permit McColl's Newsagency on Canterbury Rd, Davyhulme to have a licence to sell alcohol.

There is no need of a second shop on Canterbury Rd to sell alcohol, the grocery store at the end of the row of shops already provides this service, and is more than adequate for the local population. There are sufficient shops in and around Urmston and Davyhulme for people to purchase all the alcohol they require.

Having McColls open till 11.00pm at night will increase the amount of road traffic on the estate, and probably increase the noise volume, and the amount of litter that people leave behind. At weekend we often find empty bottles deposited in our front garden or left on the road, and this will get worse with a second shop selling alcohol. It also increases the risk of vandalism & robbery, as McColls has been raided a few times for cigarettes.

We pride ourselves on living on a good estate and this will only bring unwelcome visitors to our roads. We live close to the row of shops and do not want further disturbance in an evening due to people hanging around McColls, in order to drink what they have purchased.

We would urge the council when considering this application to listen to the people who live near to the shop and make a sensible decision to decline this request.

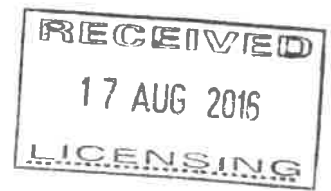

I am writing to register my objection to the application for a premises licence by Martins, 173 Canterbury Road, Davyhulme, Manchester, M41 0SE. The basis for this opposition is that granting a licence for these premises will not promote the licensing objectives, particularly the prevention of crime, disorder and antisocial behaviour.

173 Canterbury Road lies within the Council's Cumulative Impact Area, and enabling the premises to sell alcohol would be totally detrimental to its aims and objectives. The application proposes that alcohol will be sold for consumption off the premises between 6:00am and 11:00pm, seven days a week. Granting a licence would provide a further source of alcohol within an area already so heavily populated with licensed premises that crime, disorder and public nuisance have already reached problem levels for the local police.

Residents in this area already suffer noise nuisance and antisocial behaviour at all hours of the day and night. They have endured this inconvenience since 2003 when the licensing legislation was first amended, and it is totally unacceptable to expect them to continue to do so.

I would also urge the Committee to consider the findings of the Health Impact Assessment, in which evidence of the negative effects of the flexible licensing hours was put forward by local residents.

Granting a licence will increase underage buying activities because local residents are already suffering these kind of activities. Granting a licence will also impact on children safety.

In view of the above, I would urge the Licensing Authority to refuse the application.
