27. MINUTES

29. APPLICATION FOR PRIVATE HIRE DRIVER'S LICENCE - MEDICAL REQUIREMENT

The Head of Regulatory Services submitted a report requesting Members to consider an application for the grant of a private hire driver's licence where the applicant is unable to provide a medical certificate signed by his own doctor in accordance with the council's requirements.

The applicant attended the meeting to enable members to give the matter their full consideration.

The applicant informed the Sub-Committee of the steps he had taken to meet the council's requirements.

The Sub-Committee considered the report and the information provided by Mr. J.S. but concluded that Mr. J.S. had not met the council's requirements.

RESOLVED: That Mr. J. S' application for a Private Hire driver's licence be refused.

30. ALLEGATION OF REFUSAL BY A HACKNEY CARRIAGE DRIVER TO PUT A FARE ON THE METER FOR A JOURNEY WITHIN THE COMPELLABLE AREA

The Head of Regulatory Services submitted a report requesting Members to consider an allegation of refusal by a Hackney Carriage driver, to put a fare on the meter for a journey within the compellable area.

The driver attended the meeting to enable members to give the matter their full consideration.

The driver's solicitor gave an outline of what Mr. S. A said was the circumstances of the incident.

The driver and his solicitor also answered questions from Sub-Committee Members.

Having considered the written evidence and evidence given at the meeting, they were of the view that it was more than probable that an incident had occurred and were mindful that Mr. S. A could not recall the incident.

RESOLVED: That 100 penalty points be issued to Mr. S. A under the Council's Penalty Point Scheme.
