24. SERIES OF COMPLAINTS REGARDING THE CONDUCT OF A TRAFFORD LICENSED HACKNEY CARRIAGE DRIVER

The Head of Regulatory Services submitted a report requesting Members to consider a series of complaints which had been received by the Licensing Service regarding the same driver.

The driver attended the meeting to enable members to give the matter their full consideration.

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The driver provided the Sub-Committee with an outline of what he said were the circumstances of the complaints.

The driver also answered questions directed to him from Sub-Committee Members.

The Sub-Committee considered three complaints, in relation to the recent complaint; the Sub-Committee noted that you denied the allegation. However, having considered the written evidence, they were of the view that it was more than probable that the incident had occurred as described by the Civil Enforcement Officer.

The Sub-Committee considered the evidence put forward by the Licensing Officers and the responses to questions about the allegations by the driver's solicitor and concluded that the driver was not a fit and proper person to hold a Hackney Carriage driver's licence.

RESOLVED: That Mr. K's Hackney Carriage driver's licence be suspended for one month.
