### 1. Introduction

- **1.1** Section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003 outlines the procedure whereby an application can be made to the Licensing Authority for variation of a premises licence.
- **1.2** Section 35(3) of the Licensing Act 2003 states that where relevant representations are made in respect of such an application, the authority must:
  - (a) hold a hearing to consider them, unless the authority, the applicant and each person who has made such representations agree that a hearing is unnecessary, and
  - (b) having regard to the representations, take such of the steps mentioned in subsection (4) (if any) as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives.
- **1.3** The steps mentioned in subsection (4) are:
  - (a) to modify the conditions of the licence;
  - (b) to reject the whole or part of the application;

and for this purpose the new conditions of the licence are modified if any of them is altered or omitted or any new condition is added.

### 2. Background

- 2.1 On the 1<sup>st</sup> December 2017 the Licensing section received an application from TLT Solicitors acting on behalf of their clients Green King Retailing Ltd, for the grant of a full variation of the premises licence for the premise known as Brooklands Tap, Hope Road, Sale, Cheshire, M33 3YA, which currently has a Premises Licence PL000125. A copy of this application is attached at Appendix 1. A copy of the current licence is attached at Appendix 2.
- **2.2** As detailed in the application, the applicant has applied to;

Extend the live and recorded music hours in line with the below:

• From 11:00h until 00:00h on Thursday (currently permitted from 11:00h until 23:00h)

Extend the sale of alcohol hours as follows:

- From 11:00h until 01:00h on Thursday (currently permitted from 11:00h until 23:00h)
- From 11:00h until 01:00h on a Friday and Saturday (currently permitted from 11:00h until 00:00h)

### Page 2

Extend the opening hours of the premises as follows:

- From 11:00h until 01:30h on Thursday (currently permitted from 11:00h until 23:30h)
- From 11:00h until 01:30h Friday and Saturday (currently permitted from 11:00h until 00:30h)

Furthermore, the applicant has confirmed that they are willing to comply with the following additional conditions to promote the licensing objectives:

- An incident and refusals log ('the log') will be kept and maintained at the premises and all incidents and refusals of sales of alcohol shall be recorded in it. As a minimum, the log will record the date and time of the incident/refusal, the name of the person making the entry, the nature of the incident/refusal and any actions taken.
- Children are to be supervised by a responsible adult at all times.
- Children shall not be permitted on the premises after 20:00hrs unless taking part in a function or table meal, when they shall be permitted to remain on the premises until the end of that meal or function.
- CCTV system will be installed and maintained at the premises.
- CCTV will be stored for 31 days and recordings made available for the Police upon request.
- Noise checks will be carried out at the boundary of the premises when regulated entertainment is provided. The details of checks completed, the findings and any action taken, if required, will be recorded.
- The premises will operate a 'Challenge 21' policy. All staff will be trained in the following:
  - a) Challenge 21 policy
  - b) The premises licence and its conditions.
  - A record shall be kept of this training which will be refreshed no less than every 6 months and this record shall be available for inspection by the Licensing Authority or Police upon request.

The applicant has further requested that should the above conditions be imposed, present conditions 6 and 8 to be removed from the licence, they are;

Condition 6 – No children to be allowed on the premises after 19:00hrs

Condition 8 – Persons who are attempting to buy alcohol who appear to be under the age of 18 years shall be required to produce proof of age by way of a recognised proof of age card accredited under the Proof of Age Standards Scheme (PASS) or if a proof of age card is not available a photo driving licence, passport or accredited student card.

**2.3** The applicant has complied with all requirements under the application process including advertising the application in a newspaper, advertising by way of public notice at the premises and submitting a copy of the complete application to all Responsible Authorities. The application is deemed to be correctly submitted.

### 3. Representations

3.1 The Licensing Authority has received 6 representations from local residents and one from a ward Councillor opposing the grant of the application. The representations all mainly relate to the Prevention of Public Nuisance licensing objective. Copies of the representations are attached at Appendix 3.

### 4. Licensing Policy and Guidance

**4.1** The Committee are respectfully referred to the Council's own Licensing Policy relating to the Licensing Act 2003 objectives and to the Secretary of State's Guidance (copy available at meeting).

### 5. Options

- **5.1** The Sub-Committee are requested to consider the evidence and decide what (if any) steps to take as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives. The steps specified are:
  - (a) to modify the conditions of the licence;
  - (b) to reject the whole or part of the application;

and for this purpose the new conditions of the licence are modified if any of them is altered or omitted or any new condition is added.

- **5.2** The Sub-Committee is advised that any findings on any issues of fact should be on the balance of probability and any decision should be based on the individual merits of the application.
- **5.3** The Sub-Committee, in arriving at its decision, must have regard to relevant provisions of national guidance and its own statement of licensing policy and reasons should be given for any departure.

- 3. There shall be placed at all exits from the premises in a place where they can be seen and easily read by the public, (or member and their guests) notices requiring customers to leave the premises and the area quietly. (Note, this may also include a reference to vehicles)
- 4. No external regulated entertainm ent is permitted.
- 5. All windows and external doors to be kept shut during live performances save for customer access and egress.
- 6. No children to be allowed on the premises after 19:00 hours.
- 7. For premises where entertainment takes place on a regular basis, music and associated sources (including DJ's and amplified voices) should generally not be audible inside noise sensitive properties at any time. Where entertainment takes place less frequently, such noise should generally not be audible inside noise sensitive properties between 23:00 and 07:00 hours. (Based on IOA Good Practice Guide on the Control of Noise from Pubs and Clubs)
- 8. Persons who are attempting to buy alcohol who appear to be under the age of 18 years shall be required to produce proof of age by way of a recognised proof of age card accredited under the Proof of Age Standards Scheme (PASS) or if a proof of age card is not available a photo driving licence, passport or accredited student card.

### Dear Sir or Madam

We wish to register our objections to the above licensing application as listed below.

### 1 Prevention of crime and disorder

Currently the public house has provided a "smokers facility" at both the front and rear of the property. However as the evening wears on the front rooms are frequently closed early and the patrons transfer to the rear of the building (the concert room) which is closer to the residential properties. This means the rear outside facility is often used not just as a smoking area but as a congregation point, with an increase in sound levels emanating from this area.

Whilst the current and previous landlords have attempted to ensure drugs are not used on the premises, often patrons can be observed alongside the dividing wall between the public house and the Asda site and a strong smell of cannabis is evident. Additionally patrons have been observed climbing over this wall effecting ingress and egress between the public house site and the Asda shop during its normal operating hours and also after the Asda site has closed at 11-00pm.

### 2 Public Safety.

Glenthorn Grove is often used as overspill parking by public house patrons and to have these vehicles accessed and driven away at the times this proposal requests will be even more intrusive to the residents. Hope Rd is used as a short cut and late at night vehicles have been known to exceed the speed limit. The chance of an accident is likely to be increased with vehicles unexpectedly exiting our grove after 1-30am. At weekends vehicles are regularly left parked overnight.

### 3 Prevention of public nuisance.

The room where the regulated entertainment is presented is totally unsuited for this purpose. It is a low ceiling room with no air control system which when placed under the stress of a performance to all intents and purposes becomes the equivalent of an open air function with all the windows and rear doors being opened. This scenario continues well beyond the 10-30pm threshold imposed at outdoor venues, sometimes even beyond the 12-00am cut off time currently in place at the site. Once the entertainment has terminated patrons will sit outside at the rear of the premises conversing and shouting till well past 1-00am.

It is our understanding that no other commercial social premise located within the immediate vicinity operates after 12-30am and most of the restaurants close at around 10-00pm.

This is a suburban venue located within a fundamentally residential area, not town centre Sale, whose only increase in footfall is likely to be passing "topping up trade" and I see no justification for a request to extend the opening hours on Thursday, Friday and Saturday.

### 4 Protection of children from harm

Any increase in opening hours is certain to extend the noise period emanating from the premises, creating problems for families in the area, particularly for those with young children.,

The venue is evidently a problem for Greene King as they have used a number of landlords during recent years who have tried varied options to increase trade. However their plans and projects seem to have been counterproductive as what was once a very community orientated public house is currently no longer utilised by the vast majority of M33 residents.

I have been asked by Mr Ian McGinty and Mr K Ashton of Glenthorn Grove in Sale to support their objections to the application LA0511/17 for extended opening hours for the Brooklands Tap pub on Hope Road, Sale. I understand that Mr McGinty and Mr Ashton (and other residents) will also submit their own objections.

My main objection is based on the concern about the potential increase in public nuisance. This public house is situated in a residential area. Houses on Glenthorn Grove and, to some extent, on Hope Road are situated very close to these premises. The car park for the pub is located immediately behind houses on Glenthorn Grove.

The proposed extension of hours for the playing of music until midnight, the sale of alcohol until 1.00am and for closing time until 1.30am will inevitably cause more nuisance for the residential neighbours. Not only will there be the likelihood of more noise generated from the music and other activities within the building but also when patrons leave the premises. At present patrons often sit outside the rear of the premises shouting and laughing. With the proposed later opening hours this nuisance will worsen and people and vehicles will be leaving the car park after the pub has closed at 1.30am. In addition, patrons often use Glenthorn Grove itself as an extension of the pub car park. Noise nuisance will therefore be spread over a wider area.

I wish to make a formal objection to the proposed extension of the music and licensing hours at The Brooklands Tap on Hope Road, Sale.

As a resident of Glenthorn Grove, half of the rooms in my house back onto the car park and rear of the Tap premises. During the Summer months, the back doors of the pub are often open and the noise is excessive and can be obtrusive. Extending the pub's opening hours will only add to this disturbance for myself and many others on Glenthorn Grove.

Whilst I do not wish the pub to close, extending the opening hours will only encourage those customers who wish to drink after normal closing hours elsewhere. Restaurants in the vicinity close at 10pm and most pubs in Sale close before <u>1am</u>, especially on a Thursday. The behaviour of those seeking to continue drinking into these later hours goes hand in hand with unruly behaviour which is a public nuisance and even a danger to public safety, especially when the customers leave the pub and their antisocial behaviour spills over into Glenthorn Grove. I have personally had experience of this, after being knocked down and hospitalised by a drink driver leaving the Tap car park.

This is an objection in reference to the new application by Brooklands Tap for extending opening hours and sell alcohol between the hours of 11am and 1:30am, Thursday to Saturday.

In addition to the points already raised against the original application we would like to raise the following concerns by way of formal objection.

Extending the opening hours extends the sale of alcohol consumption which will draw unwelcome attention and increased footfall at unsociable hours to a residential and conservation area.

Noise, public nuisance, anti-social behaviour, low-level nuisance (non reportable crime inc. shouting, swearing, urination in public, littering) will be increased.

The noise level from the Live and Recorded Music is already a nuisance and can be heard playing until 11:00pm throughout the residential area where many children are trying to sleep never mind extending this to 1.30am.

In addiction, there are many public houses on Glenthorn Grovein close proximity to the proposed site.
