Report Title: Trafford Pharmaceutical Needs Assessment (PNA)

Summary.

The report provides information on the process that will be undertaken to develop and publish Trafford Pharmaceutical Needs Assessment (PNA) which is a statutory requirement of the Health and Well Being Board.

1. Background

Section 128A of the National Health Service Act 2006 (NHS Act 2006) requires each Health and Wellbeing board to assess the need for pharmaceutical services in its area (this is referred to as a pharmaceutical needs assessment, PNA) and has a statutory responsibility to publish its assessment.

Trafford's last published PNA covered the period August 2017 to August 2020. Copy available [Trafford Pharmaceutical Needs Assessment](#)

2. Content

The PNA aims to identify whether current pharmaceutical service provision meets the needs of the population and consider whether there are any gaps to service delivery. They assist local commissioners and service providers by giving an evidence base on how best to plan and commission pharmacy services to meet the needs of the population. Guidance on completing the PNA is detailed at

Each PNA covers

- A statement of the pharmaceutical services provided that are necessary to meet needs in the area;
- A statement of the pharmaceutical services that have been identified by the HWB that are needed in the area, and are not provided (gaps in provision);
- A statement of the other services which are provided, which are not needed, but which have secured improvements or better access to pharmaceutical services in the area;
- A statement of the services that the HWB has identified as not being provided, but which would, if they were to be provided, secure improvements or better access to pharmaceutical services in the area;
- A statement of other NHS services provided by a local authority, the NHS Commissioning Board (NHS England), a Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG) or an NHS Trust, which affect the needs for pharmaceutical services;
- An explanation of how the assessment has been carried out (including how the consultation was carried out); and
- A map of providers of pharmaceutical services.

3. Development of Trafford's PNA 2022 – 2025

3.1 Trafford Council is required to publish its new PNA by 1st October 2022. A PNA Steering Group will be set up to oversee the development of the new PNA, including membership from our partner organisations, Trafford CCG, Healthwatch and the Local Pharmaceutical Committee.

3.2 As part of the development process, the Regulations require that the Health and Well Being Board undertakes a formal consultation on a draft of its PNA. The key outcomes for this consultation are:

- To encourage constructive feedback from a variety of stakeholders
- To ensure a wide range of primary care health professionals provide opinions and views on what is contained within the PNA.

4. Proposed timetable

In order to achieve the required statutory activities to develop and publish the PNA it is proposed that the

- Public and Pharmacy surveys to be sent out in May.
- Consultation draft of Trafford's PNAs will be presented to Health and Wellbeing Board/ or delegated to the Steering Group for sign-off in June/ July 2022
- 60 day public consultation (potentially 27th June, 2022 – 26th August 2022)
- Final pharmaceutical needs assessment signed off by Health and Wellbeing board in September 2022.

5. Recommendations

Report Title: Drugs and Alcohol Funding

Summary.

Trafford, along with all other Local Authorities, will be receiving additional funds over at least the next three years to support the implementation of the treatment and recovery elements of the Government's 10 Year Drugs Strategy published in December 2021.

1. Background

In response to Dame Carol Black's review of drugs, which makes it clear that the drug treatment and recovery system in England is not able to operate to the standard needed to address current challenges, the Government published its 10 Year Drugs Strategy 'From Harm to Hope' in December of last year. It aims to reduce crime and both the supply and demand for drugs by enhancing drug and alcohol treatment.

2. The new funding

Additional funds will be available to all local authorities in England for the next three years. Fifty areas will receive extra money in the first year on top of the universal government funding, a further 50 areas will receive their extra money in 23/24 and the remainder (including Trafford) will receive the extra in 24/25.

In 21/22 we received a total of £201,000 universal grant funding in Trafford and we have now been given indicative allocations for the next three years. These amounts are unconfirmed and embargoed at this time, but we expect our allocation for years 1 and 2 will be at least as much as we received in 21/22. Then in 24/25 we will receive our uplift.

It is hoped that the additional funding will continue beyond 24/25, but due to the 3 year spending review cycle this remains uncertain.

3. How the money is to be spent

The funding will be dependent on maintaining existing (2020/21) investment in drug and alcohol treatment.

There is a national target to increase the number of treatment places by 54,500 - a 20% increase. In Trafford we need to agree with our provider/s a three-year trajectory that contributes towards this national ambition. We also need to set out how the grant funding will reduce drug and alcohol deaths locally, both in and out of treatment.

There are a number of metrics we are required to develop locally, and a menu of interventions which we need to base our proposals on.

There is an Inpatient Detoxification Grant which will be awarded to regional or sub-regional consortia.

The drug strategy also commits to expanding the provision of Individual Placement and Support employment support (IPS) across England. We don't currently have this service in Trafford so we will work with OHID to implement it locally.

4. Immediate considerations

We expect to be asked to submit outline plans for how we intend to spend the funding in April 2022.

To meet government expectations around local accountability, we need to consider what commissioning capacity we will require now and in the future.

We are required to have a local drugs and alcohol partnership, with a wide range of stakeholders including the police and crime commissioner, the local health and social care system, probation and NHS health and justice colleagues. It is anticipated this partnership may fit best with our existing governance system as a subgroup of the Safer Trafford Partnership.
