## RESULT OF BY-ELECTION FOR BUCKLOW ST. MARTINS WARD AND POLITICAL GROUP COMPOSITION

## Summary

To note the result of the Poll held on 14 September 2017 for the Bucklow St. Martins Ward of the Borough and to advise Council of a change to the political composition of the Council and the position in relation to the constitution of Council Committees for the remainder of the 2017/18 municipal year.

## Recommendation(s)

1) That the election of Aidan James Williams as an elected Member for the Bucklow St. Martins Ward be noted.
2) That the current composition of the political groups on the Council, as set out in the report, be noted.
3) That the Council notes that there will be no consequential change to the allocation of Committee places.

## 1. Bucklow St. Martins By-election

1.1 The result of the Poll held on 14 September 2017 saw the candidate Aidan James Williams elected as a Member for the Bucklow St. Martins Ward of the Borough.
1.2 Aidan James Williams has duly made the prescribed Declaration of Acceptance of Office and will hold office until May 2019.
2. Political Composition of the Council
2.1 Following the result of the By-election, the political make-up of the Council is now:

- Conservative Group - 33 members
- Labour Group - 26 members
- Liberal Democrat Group - 3 members
- Independent - 1 member.
2.2 The regulations require that the composition of committees is in accordance with the political balance of the 63 members of the Council and that this is reviewed as a result of any changes.
2.3 Subject to the need to allocate each political group a total allocation of seats in proportion to its strength on the Council, the Membership of each Ordinary Committee should be made up of the following proportions: -
- Conservative (33/63) - $52.4 \%$
- Labour (26/63) - $41.3 \%$
- Liberal Democrat (3/63) - $4.8 \%$
- Independent (1/63) - $1.6 \%$
2.4 However, as there is no requirement to offer an independent person a seat as an individual does not constitute a group, the new political makeup has no significant effect on the total allocation of seats.
2.5 The existing allocations as shown in Appendix 1 remain consistent with the political proportions of the Council and therefore, there is no requirement to change the composition of Committees. All Group Leaders have agreed to the arrangements.
