1. Introduction

- 1.1 Section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003 outlines the procedure whereby an application can be made to the Licensing Authority for variation of a premises licence.
- 1.2 Section 35(3) of the Licensing Act 2003 states that where relevant representations are made in respect of such an application, the authority must:
 - (a) hold a hearing to consider them, unless the authority, the applicant and each person who has made such representations agree that a hearing is unnecessary, and
 - (b) having regard to the representations, take such of the steps mentioned in subsection (4) (if any) as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives.
- 1.3 The steps mentioned in subsection (4) are:
 - (a) to modify the conditions of the licence;
 - (b) to reject the whole or part of the application;

and for this purpose the new conditions of the licence are modified if any of them is altered or omitted or any new condition is added.

2. Background

- 2.1 On the 12th October 2017 the Licensing section received an application from Station Bar & Grill Limited, for the grant of a full variation of the premises licence for the premise known as Station Bar & Grill, 25-29 Station Road, Urmston, M41 9JG which currently has a Premises Licence PL049273. A copy of this application is attached at **Appendix 1.** A copy of the current licence is attached at **Appendix 2.**
- 2.2 As detailed in the application, the applicant has applied to;
 - Increase the licensed area by including a first floor function room;

To include to the following licensable activities;

- Live music (indoors) Sun-Wed 23:00-01:00 / Thu-Sat 23:00-03:00
- Recorded music (indoors) Sun-Wed 23:00-01:00 / Thu-Sat 23:00-03:00
- Supply of alcohol (on the premises) Sun-Wed 12:00-01:00 / Thu-Sat 12:00-03:00

2.3 The applicant has complied with all requirements under the application process including advertising the application in a newspaper, advertising by way of public notice at the premises and submitting a copy of the complete application to all Responsible Authorities. The application is deemed to be correctly submitted.

3. Representations

3.1 The Licensing Authority has received a representation from Environmental Health Officer Mr. Peter Belfield opposing the grant of the application. A copy of the representation is attached at **Appendix 3**.

4. Licensing Policy and Guidance

4.1 The Committee are respectfully referred to the Council's own Licensing Policy relating to the Licensing Act 2003 objectives and to the Secretary of State's Guidance (copy available at meeting).

5. Options

- 5.1 The Sub-Committee are requested to consider the evidence and decide what (if any) steps to take as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives. The steps specified are:
 - (a) to modify the conditions of the licence;
 - (b) to reject the whole or part of the application;

and for this purpose the new conditions of the licence are modified if any of them is altered or omitted or any new condition is added.

- 5.2 The Sub-Committee is advised that any findings on any issues of fact should be on the balance of probability and any decision should be based on the individual merits of the application.
- 5.3 The Sub-Committee, in arriving at its decision, must have regard to relevant provisions of national guidance and its own statement of licensing policy and reasons should be given for any departure.

This application cannot be used to vary the licence so as to extend the period for which the licence has effect or to vary substantially the premises to which it relates.  - Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
 - Live music: no licence permission is required for:



o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.

a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.

o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.

a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.

a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

• Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:

o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.

o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.

o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - o any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience,




- o and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.
- 4. Where taking place in a building or other structure please tick as appropriate (indoors may include a tent).

 - (a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises, or

- (b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 3. Where the premises licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, each such individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

ADDITIONAL MANDATORY CONDITIONS (28th May 2014)

- 1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1
 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979
 - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

Where —

- (i) P is the permitted price
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol

and

- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol

- (e) "valued added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994
- 3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
 - (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

ADDITIONAL MANDATORY CONDITIONS (1st October 2014)

- 1. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purposes of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises:
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to:
 - drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise)
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner

- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability)
- 2. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 3. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either:
 - (a) a holographic mark,

or

- (b) an ultraviolet feature
- 4. The responsible person must ensure that:
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available

I have assessed the above application for a major variation to a Premises Licence and I wish to object to the application on the grounds of prevention of public nuisance as provided in the details below:

The application seeks to extend the hours of Regulated Entertainment (indoors) for Live and Recorded Music on Thursdays to Saturdays from: 00:00 to 03:00h; and Recorded Music on Sundays to Wednesdays from 2300 to 0100h. In addition, the scope of live music provision is to be increased to 0100h on Sundays to Wednesdays, from 2300h only on Sundays. The licence is to include the first floor function room within the scope of the licence.

The licenced premises is situated midway within a three storey mixed commercial and residential terraced block.

Currently, the premises benefits from planning permission for a bar and coffee lounge on the ground floor, a restaurant on the 1st floor, and a dwelling on the 2nd floor of the licenced premises to provide accommodation for the owner, tenant or proprietor. The permitted opening hours referred to in the planning decision notice (ref. H/69365) are 11:30 - 23:00 Monday to Friday, 11:30 - 23:30 Saturday, and 12:00 to 22:00 on Sundays and Bank Holidays.

Residential accommodation is situated on the 1st and 2nd floors above shops situated within the same terraced block. The 1st floor function room directly shares a party wall with a habitable room of the adjoining property.

Complaints from local residents of noise nuisance from loud music and voices emanating from the premises have been received in 2013, 2015 and most recently in March 2017, where it was alleged that live entertainment was being followed by after parties that continued through into the early hours. These complaints were dealt with informally by providing written and verbal advice to the premises management.

It is clear that the current licence provision for regulated entertainment with a curfew no later than midnight that has already resulted in repeated complaints from

residents. This licenced premises is at a disadvantage, being structurally attached to dwellings, since entertainment noise, especially at low frequencies, can readily transmit through the structure of a building and be clearly audible within habitable rooms of these dwellings.

It appears that entertainment is currently being provided on an occasional basis which combined with a midnight curfew may be why an informal approach to complaint investigation has been sufficient so far. However, the proposal to extend the opening hours and entertainment provision to 0300h over the busiest nights of the week would make it possible to viably offer the premises to customers as a late night venue with a range of live music / DJ / disco events each week.

Potentially, such events could also take place over the remaining nights of the week to 0100h. If the proposed licence provision is to be fully utilised, serious nuisance impacts including disturbance to relaxation in the evening and sleep during the night time could occur at any time.

This would be completely unacceptable to residents who would be able to clearly hear the entertainment taking place well into the night time, with such events being unrestricted in numbers. This type of impact if occurring on a regular basis would necessitate enforcement action by way of service of a Noise Abatement Notice that if breached, could render the perpetrator liable to a substantial fine and / or confiscation of all noise making equipment.

I recommend that the Licensing Sub Committee refuses this application, thus retaining the current controls, in pursuit of the licensing objective for the prevention of public nuisance.

Such changes to the nature and duration of activities being undertaken on the premises may also require an application for retrospective Planning Approval that I would also object to for similar reasons.
