7	<p>Age Friendly Trafford accreditation Trafford was accredited as an Age Friendly Community by the Centre for Ageing Better on 1st May 2019. This was awarded after we evidenced our commitment to continually improving the lives of older people in our community guided by, though not limited by, the WHO's guidelines on the 8 domains of age-friendliness.</p>
8	<p>Dementia Trafford has seen a significant rise in our number of Dementia Friends and Dementia Friendly organisations with 1,663 more being trained in 2018-19 than in the previous period, bringing our total number up to 7,419.</p> <p>This total can be broken down as follows: Active Dementia Friends Champions = 41 Dementia Friends trained face to face = 5,372 Dementia Friends trained online = 1,483 Dementia Friendly organisations = 523</p>
10	<p>Transforming Homecare Following extensive stakeholder consultation and a detailed cost benefit analysis, funding for the Homecare Transformation programme has now been agreed. Funding will support the following test and learn pilots:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Pilots which will be delivered through our existing homecare framework (through a closed tender): <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Homecare visits in Hospital • SAMS Reablement in reach in hospital and discharge to assess • Let's Talk Homecare 2. Pilots which will can be delivered by any suitable provider (through an open tender) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Assisted Discharge Service • Homecare Workforce Development Programme <p>The tender process commences mid-June 2019, with a 3 month mobilisation period from 1st September to 31st November 2019, to allow for stakeholder consultation and development of integrated working between all relevant health and social care partners. All service pilots will go live on 1st December 2019.</p> <p>The homecare transformation pilots will also support the following GM Trailblazer projects:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Admissions Avoidance Trailblazer: developing a co-ordinated response to prevent unnecessary admissions to hospital and to reduce length of stay • Blended Roles Trailblazer: developing the role of the social care workforce to prevent ill health and support people to live well at home for as long as possible

11	<p>Technology Enabled Care (TEC)</p> <p>Trafford Housing Trust currently manage our contract for TEC. This includes the installation, maintenance, repair and monitoring of TEC across Trafford, as well as testing new technology to improve health and wellbeing outcomes for local people, as per Trafford's TEC Strategy.</p> <p>We have secured transformation funding for additional, 12 month commissioning resource to support the expansion and enhancement of our local TEC offer. The post holder will commence in post from 17th June 2019. Key areas of work will include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Producing a position paper on Trafford Council's TEC offer and work to date • Improving access to and quality of the available data on TEC • Expanding and enhancing the use of TEC as follows: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Increasing the TEC offer through the homecare transformation programme to improve social inclusion and reablement outcomes ○ Increasing our TEC offer to reduce unnecessary hospital admissions ○ Increasing the use of TEC in residential and nursing homes in Trafford
11	<p>Older People's Housing Strategy</p> <p>A first draft of the report has now been completed. After gaining CLT and Exec approval, we hope to consult on the draft report in Aug/ Sept. The aim of the Older People's Housing Strategy is to improve the range and quantity of housing provision for older people and will contain an action plan and priorities for the Council.</p>
