Sarah Grant reported on the creation of a Knife Crime Sub Group under the Safer Trafford

Partnership.

The Board discussed the proposed creation of a Maternity Voices Partnership in Trafford as a joint commissioned project with Manchester CCG. Funding has not been identified in Trafford to support this.

With regards to access to children's vitamins, Sarah Grant explained the application process and the board discussed ways to make these more accessible to parents, for example directly via health visitors.

3 Outcomes Framework

Kate Hardman presented the Outcomes Framework for Start Well. Kate also referred to the Corporate Plan draft dashboard which can be viewed at https://trafforddatalab.shinyapps.io/dashboard/. The board discussed reporting on the outcome activity via the board's work plan.

Action: Kate Hardman to add immunisation levels to the outcomes framework.

The board discussed the outcomes for admission episodes for alcohol-specific conditions for under 18s. Sarah Grant and Angela Brown informed the board of Early Break, the commissioned service which supports young people with substance misuse.

Early Break have reported that for the year 2018-19 there were 15 A&E referrals in Trafford:

- 9 Females, 5 Males and 1 Non Binary
- 11 of those were closed at Tier 1 due to either parent or the young person refusing the service
- 3 are currently open
- 1 successful closure at Tier 3
- 27% engagement

The majority of hospital admissions for young people relate to binge drinking, rather than dependant drinking. After every hospital admission Early Break visit the family to offer support. Many parents refuse support initially but if a second admission occurs Early Break insist that the young person receives advice and support.

Early Break are also establishing relationships with local schools and colleges, offering presentations at assemblies, one to one work with pupils at risk and advice to teachers.

The board discussed options for helping to reduce alcohol misuse from a Trading Standards perspective. Work is being undertaken at a GM level such as a needs assessment which needs to be brought to the Start Well Board. The Alcohol Steering Group will be reastablished within the next few months.

The board discussed access to data for Domestic Violence.

Action: Kate Hardman to add a narative on the Outcomes Framework where appropriate.
