4.	Update on the current Covid-19 situation in Trafford	<ul> <li>The Board agreed to note the update. The following messages were shared with the Board:</li> <li>1. Covid-19 infection rates dropped in Trafford but slight increase in younger population;</li> <li>2. Vaccination rate good as greater than 70%. People are strongly encouraged to take second dose for greater protection;</li> <li>3. Outstanding contribution of community, faith and voluntary sector to encourage vaccination uptake;</li> <li>4. Successful Eid prayer in Trafford – thank you to all those involved;</li> </ul>	All

5	10POINT	<ul> <li>5. Lateral flow testing useful for asymptomatic people whereas those with Covid-19 symptoms should use PCR testing;</li> <li>6. People with symptoms or with positive test result tend to do their own contact tracing with family and friends. This is good practice and it should be encouraged;</li> <li>7. Continue to be cautious, avoid crowded places and follow hand hygiene, social distancing and face covering rules.</li> </ul>

Greater request for second dose;</li> <li>As 12<sup>th</sup> May in Trafford, 121,249 people have received the first dose of the vaccination and 65,868 the second one;</li> </ol> </li></ul>	All
