There has been a drop in the number of new cases however there has also been a reduction in the rate of testing and the positivity rates of tests are still high; 2. Hospitalisation rates are increasing; 3. The number of close contacts reported after a positive case is lower than would be expected so there is a need to encourage people to be honest when recording their close contacts; 4. People need to take additional care (even if vaccinated) by avoiding crowded places, meeting 	All

		people outdoors where possible, wearing a mask, keeping up with hand hygiene, and working from home if you are able.

Self-Isolation Pathfinder Update	 The following messages were shared with the Board: Proactive engagement was continuing within specified areas with people who have a positive case of covid-19; The team have successfully contacted 65% of cases and only 12% have required enhanced support; Work is ongoing to establish a text messaging service which will identify other needs that are not currently covered by the service. There are two new types of Lateral Flow testing available; the Orient Gene test will be used for schools and only takes 15 minutes to get a result and the Flow Flex test will be used more widely.
