Update on the current Covid-19 situation in Trafford	<ul> <li>The Board agreed to note the update.</li> <li>The following messages were shared with the Board: <ol> <li>There had been an increase in the infection rates within Trafford to 300 per 100,000;</li> <li>The 19-24 and 30-34 populations had the highest rates of infection;</li> <li>It was important to encourage vaccination to reduce the risk of Covid-19;</li> <li>People needed to take additional care (even if vaccinated) by avoiding crowded places, meeting people outdoors where possible, wearing a mask, keeping up with hand hygiene, and working from home if able.</li> </ol> </li> </ul>	All

	Pathfinder Update	<ul> <li>The following messages were shared with the Board:</li> <li>1. Proactive engagement was continuing within specified areas with people who had a positive case of covid-19 although the scheme was due to end mid-September;</li> <li>2. The team had successfully contacted 690 people with a positive case of covid-19;</li> <li>3. The service had been rolled out to M32 and M33 postcodes alongside work in M15 and M16</li> </ul>	AII

	Mass Testing	<ul> <li>The Board agreed to note the update.</li> <li>The following messages were shared with the Board: <ol> <li>From 16<sup>th</sup> August, people would need to be double vaccinated and have a negative PCR test to be exempt from self-isolating as a close contact;</li> <li>Two new types of Lateral Flow testing were available which provided results in 15 minutes;</li> <li>Secondary schools were to use the Orient Gene Lateral Flow test from September;</li> <li>That it was important to encourage the continued regular testing within workplace settings;</li> <li>That a PCR test was needed if someone experienced covid-19 symptoms.</li> </ol> </li> </ul>	AII
	Contact Tracing and Outbreak Management	<ul> <li>The Board agreed to note the update.</li> <li>The following messages were shared with the Board: <ol> <li>As the regulations around self-isolating were changing, the team were awaiting guidance on how to verify who needed to isolate and who did not;</li> <li>From 16<sup>th</sup> August, the following will be exempt from isolating: <ol> <li>Under 18s</li> <li>Those fully vaccinated more than 2 weeks before a positive contact</li> <li>Anyone who has taken part in vaccine trials</li> <li>Anyone who cannot be vaccinated due to medical reasons</li> </ol> </li> </ol></li></ul>	AII

	Mass Vaccination	<ul> <li>The Board agreed to note the update.</li> <li>The following messages were shared with the Board: <ol> <li>308,000 people had received at least one dose of the vaccine;</li> <li>82% of eligible over 18s had received their first dose;</li> <li>72% of eligible over 18s had received their second dose;</li> <li>Guidance on the 16-17 year olds vaccine offer had not been released but was expected;</li> <li>Five GP networks had expressed an interest in delivering the booster phase 3 vaccination but confirmation and guidance for the programme were yet to be released.</li> </ol> </li> </ul>	All

Update and escalations from the COVID-19 Community Engagement Group	<ul> <li>The Board agreed to note the update.</li> <li>The following messages were shared with the Board: <ol> <li>The 'Summer Engagement Programme' had begun and the team were visiting each neighbourhood in Trafford;</li> <li>The programme was emphasising the importance of a healthy lifestyle and was called 'Shape up for Summer';</li> <li>The programme had been well received by the community and activities would continue to take place over the following month.</li> </ol> </li> </ul>	N/A
