Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions

MANDATORY CONDITIONS

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:
 - (a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises,or
 - (b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended
2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
3. Where the premises licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, each such individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

ADDITIONAL MANDATORY CONDITIONS (28th May 2014)

4. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
5. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1:
 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979



(b) “permitted price” is the price found by applying the formula

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

Where

(i) P is the permitted price

(ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol

and

(iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol

(c) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence

(i) the holder of the premises licence

(ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or

(iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;

(d) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

(e) “value added tax” means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

6. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

7. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day (“the first day”) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (“the second day”) as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

ADDITIONAL MANDATORY CONDITIONS (1st October 2014)

8. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out,



arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises

- (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purposes of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises:
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to:
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise)
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability)
9. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
10.
 - (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to



produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either:

(a) a holographic mark

or

(b) an ultraviolet feature

11. The responsible person must ensure that:

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures

(i) beer or cider: ½ pint

(ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and

(iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and

(b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and

(c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available

Annex 2 – Conditions Consistent with the Operating Schedule

1. The premises license holder shall ensure that staff at the premises are trained in respect of licensing legislation, responsible retailing, refusal of service and challenge 25 as benefits their particular roles at the premises.

2. Non-intoxicating beverages, including drinking water, shall be available in all parts of the premises where alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises.

3. The premises shall maintain a comprehensive CCTV system on the licensed premises.

4. CCTV cameras cover internal and external areas of the premises and all areas where customers have legitimate access (Excluding Toilets).

5. One CCTV camera is specifically positioned at the entrance to capture facial images of any persons entering the premises at the main entrance and all other entrances where access is granted.

6. All areas are sufficiently illuminated for the purposes of the recording of CCTV images.

7. All CCTV recorded images have sufficient clarity/quality/definition to enable facial recognition to an evidential standard.

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8. CCTV images are retained in an unedited format for a period of 31 consecutive days.
9. Any person left in charge of the premises is trained in the use of any such CCTV equipment and is able to produce/download/burn CCTV images to an evidential standard.
10. CCTV is maintained on a regular basis and kept in good working order at all times and images shall be produced to the Police or Authorised Licensing Officers (Trafford Council Licensing Service) immediately upon request.
11. The CCTV system records images at all times that any member of the public is at or on the premises. For the purpose of this condition a "member of the public" is defined as is any person other than the DPS, Premises Licence Holder, Spouse, Partner or Employee thereof.
12. Posters are clearly and prominently displayed at the entrance and exit of the Premises stating that CCTV is in operation and that images are being captured for the purposes of crime prevention and public safety.
13. Posters shall be clearly and prominently displayed stating Premises operate a zero tolerance policy to drugs.
14. Notices shall be prominently displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and businesses and leave the area quietly.
15. Notices shall be prominently displayed at any area used for smoking requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and use the area quietly.
16. The premises licence holder shall ensure that any patrons drinking and/or smoking shall do so in the designated external garden area. The approved arrangements at the premises, including means of escape provisions, emergency warning equipment, the electrical installation and mechanical equipment, shall at all material times be maintained in good condition and full working order.
17. The Premises Licence Holder shall operate a strict "no drugs" policy at the premises with notices advising customers of the policy clearly displayed at the entrance to the Premises.
18. A Challenge 25 proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as a driving licence, passport or proof of age card with the PASS Hologram.
19. A record shall be kept detailing all refused sales of alcohol. The record should include the date and time of the refused sale and the name of the member of staff who refused the sale. The record shall be available for inspection at the premises by the police or an authorised officer of the Council at all times whilst the premises is open.
20. The Designated Premises Supervisor must ensure that no drinks are taken or consumed outside the premises nor glasses/bottles removed from the premises by patrons after 21:00hrs

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until opening for business the following day.

21. The furniture in the outside seating area shall be removed by 21:00hrs and not be returned until opening for business the following day.

22. Notices shall be displayed in a prominent position next to the entrance/exit detailing that no drinks to be taken outside after 21:00hrs.
